What Is a Social Good?

A social good also known as “common good,” benefits the largest number of people in the largest possible way, such as clean air, clean water, healthcare, and literacy. Social good can trace its history to Ancient Greek philosophers and implies a positive impact on individuals or society in general. It also provides the basis for charity or philanthropic work.

Concept & History

The official relations between Pakistan and Turkey were established in 1947. The establishment of the two states, more precisely during the Turkish War of Independence when the Muslims of the north-western British Raj sent financial aid, non-food items to the declining Ottoman Empire. That was followed by the formation of the Turkish Republic and the Independence of Pakistan. Both countries are connected with each other by virtue of religion, culture and emotional perspectives. Pakistan aided Turkey in 1999 and

The journey of helping each other shaped in complementary gestures of Social Good that enters into a new pattern when a Pakistan based NGO “The NGO World Foundation” founded by Mr. Zafar Iqbal joined hands to Turkish humanitarian officials to serve suffered humanity. Hence, the connection is converted in to a collaboration to demonstrate the sufferings of disaster affected people of Pakistan. This impressive humanitarian journey began in 2010 with the rehabilitation of flood victims of Pakistan.

2011 earthquakes showing brotherhood gesture. Later on the Turkish government and humanitarian agencies spent millions on the reconstruction and rehabilitation of houses, educational institutions, health and relief activities in the 2005 earthquake affected areas of Azad Jammu and Kashmir and Khyber Pakhtunkhwa.

The NGO World Foundation with co-operation of various government and non-governmental charities from Turkey, successfully completed various projects of social development including sustainable livelihood of poor communities, women skills development and higher education, free schooling and training of thousands of underprivileged children through Non-

Formal education system, initiatives of Islamic micro-finance for poverty alleviation, construction of mosques, capacity building of professionals, awareness raising, food gifts distribution in Ramadan, regular Qurbani programs, clean environment and so on. All these initiatives were proved helpful to reshape the lives of underprivileged communities.

Founder, now Chairman of The NGO World Foundation owned the responsibility, focused on the tasks and projects with a sense of “Amanah” and completed welfare activities with responsibility, sincerity, hard work and due diligence. Meanwhile, thousands of families were uplifted with the support of Turkish organizations. The NGO World Foundation also built the institutional capacity by working with professional organizations of Turkey. Different capacity building programs synergized the organization itself and officials. Since



Pakistan and Turkey are tied with strong bonding brotherhood. Chairman of The NGO World Foundation and his team tried their best to ensure atmosphere of trust prevailed and practiced with transparency in all projects.

The background of the “Brotherhood for Social Good” is that, whatever work is done with mutual cooperation to make human life easier, it should be used as a tool to promote sense and feeling of brotherhood among the people of two brotherly countries. The NGO World Foundation has been successful in this regard because of sincere efforts of Mr. Zafar Iqbal – Founding Chairman of The NGO World Foundation.

The NGO World Foundation has completed projects in partnership with almost every renowned Turkish organizations including TiKA, Turk Kizilay, Turkiye Diyanet Vakfi, Deniz Feneri and others. Capacity building workshops and research projects were managed in collaboration with SESRIC (subsidiary organ of OIC) whose headquarter is in Ankara.

Showing great success, few projects have been recognized at national level by different departments of Government of Pakistan and internationally by JICA, such as ZEST Project (an educational intervention) and Barkat Project (an Islamic micro-finance scheme) are the leading programs of the The NGO World Foundation and Turkish organizations. The presentations were also made with OIC representatives in Turkey.

The work done by The NGO World Foundation in collaboration of Turkish aid agencies actually endorsed the statement of honourable President of the Republic of Turkey, Recep Tayyip Erdogan, when he addressed Pakistani Parliament during the floods 2010.

Pakistan had not left Turkey alone during its War of Independence and after Turkey was hit by a massive earthquake in 1999. - 2. Programs and Projects for Sustainable Development**



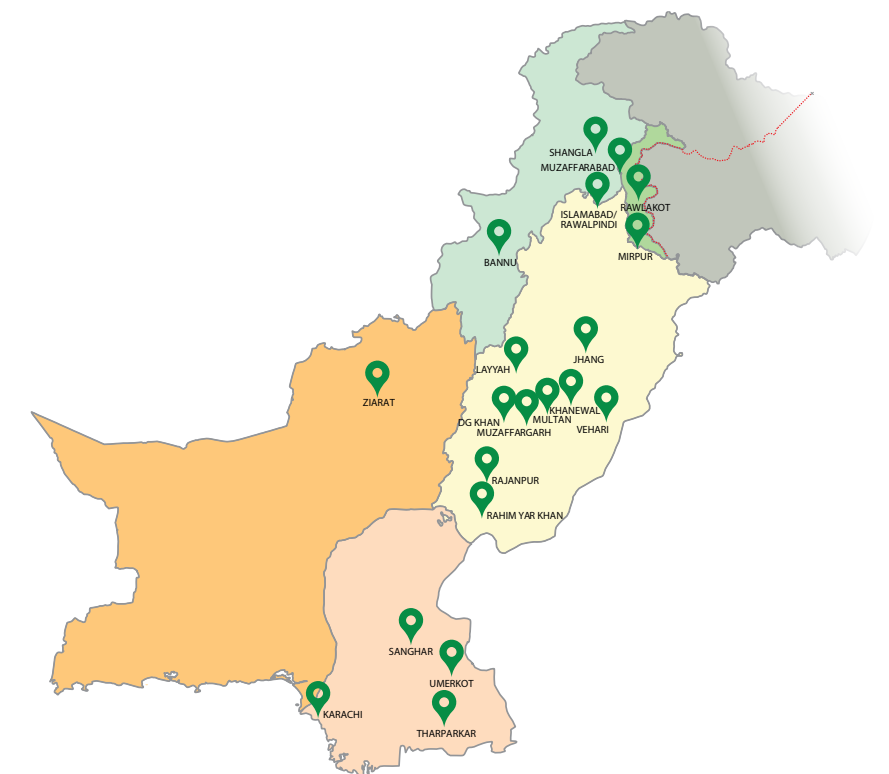

In 2010 flood, 20% area of Pakistan was under water and Government of Pakistan was seeking support from international community to cope with emergency situation. Governments, United Nation and other Humanitarian Organizations from entire world rushed in affected areas to provide relief to the victims.

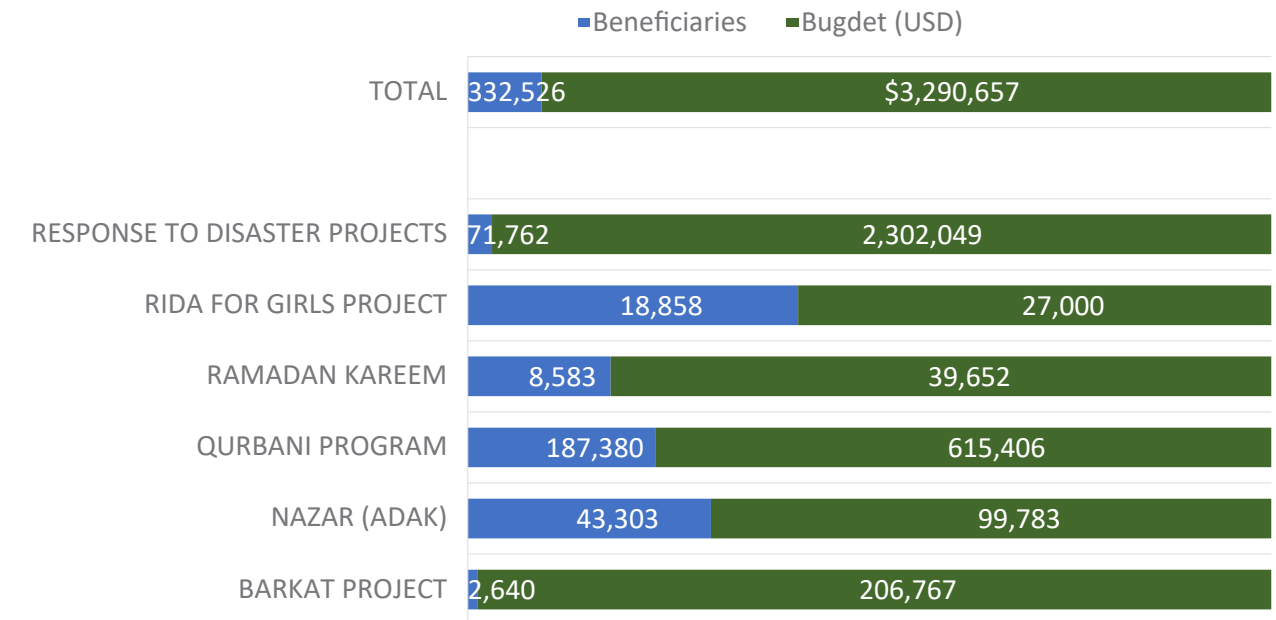
In order to show solidarity, Mr. Tayyab Erdogan (Prime Minster of Turkey) with his wife also visited the affected areas and appealed his nation to help Pakistan under these circumstances. On this appeal, Deniz Feneri planned to respond the situation. Therefore, The NGO World Foundation and Deniz Feneri established a mutual collaboration to respond suffering of flood affected communities of south Punjab. The Chairman of The NGO World Foundation Mr. Zafar Iqbal signed 1st ever agreement of partnership with Mr. Mustafa Tutkun of Deniz Feneri. This was proved milestone to strengthen the brotherhood for the cause of social good.

Officials of both organizations visited the affected areas to provide food and other stuff. After provision of food, both organizations entered into a strategic partnership and launched different projects of social development to benefit thousands of families with different needs. Jointly both too work on multiple initiatives which includes focusing on girl's education, poverty alleviation, and social support of the deserving families and other seasonal programs of charitable purpose.

Initiation of BARKAT Project



BARKAT (Arabic: بركة "blessing") was launched with a clear goal to improve the living standard of target vulnerable deserving families by using livestock as a tool of poverty alleviation.

The NGO World Foundation with support of Deniz Feneri has been providing- ethical alternative to poverty alleviation through BARKAT program launched in 2012 in district Khanewal of Pakistan under principles of Shari'ah. The BARKAT program has two major components;

- Under special kind of partnership, BARKAT provides the cattle (rabb-ul-maal) to the household level livestock Farmers (mudarib) as investment to improve their economic conditions. It is through involvement in productive livestock activities. Both parties share profit and loss i.e. organization and individual
- Under another scheme, financial assistance is provided by Interest Free Loans to help the poor establish, or uplift their small scale businesses to support their living.

Provision of Calves/Bulls to Household Livestock Farmers to Enhance their Yearly Income

Due to importance of livestock in economy and the life of a common man; The NGO World Foundation has taken initiatives to join hands with the Government trying to improve the livestock sector that will ultimately contribute to alleviate poverty and raise living standard of the small livestock farmers.

In 2012, The NGO World Foundation in collaboration with Deniz Feneri launched an initiative "BARKAT" Project. The benefits of the project to the target beneficiaries are now visible in shape of income enhancement.

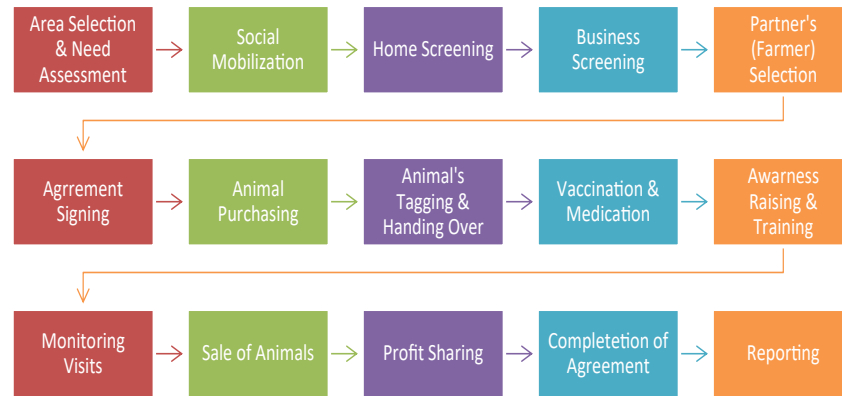
Since launch of the project, The NGO World Foundation has been providing bulls by signing an agreement with the poor and low-income farmers, based on specific set of term and conditions. During the period of 8-10 months, farmers take care of cattle (fodder/protection) while organization provided services for animal's health and extension services.

After the agreement period animals were sold and profit/loss divided to farmer (67%) and The NGO World Foundation (33%) according to the terms & conditions. The farming family gets the profit and TNW use its profit to other poor families. Hence cycle repeats.

Case Study

Mr. Chaman's Shop



Mr. Zafar Noonari joined a community group of village Ghareebabad formed by BARKAT team to handover them cattle (bulls). In order to support his son Chaman he wanted to establish a small shop” but due to limited resources he was unable to do so. Mr. Zafar Noonari was ambitious to put his unemployed son on some work to ensure sustainable livelihood for him.

When he came to know about BARKAT initiative, he joined this group and got two bulls on partnership basis. After eight months of hard work he was able to earn a handful profit and to support his son to establish his small business. The shop is helping Chaman to earn his livelihood on sustainable basis.

This how BARKAT is contributing towards sustainability and poverty alleviation. There are hundreds of beneficiaries like Mr. Chaman.

BARKAT Interest Free Loan Scheme was launched in 2019 as a new initiative of The NGO World Foundation in Tehsil Kabirwala, District Khanewal with the aim to help the poor establish, or uplift their small scale businesses to support their living.

BARKAT Interest Free Loan Scheme to Sustain Small Businesses

Launched in Support of National Poverty Graduation Initiative



Interest free or charity based micro-finance models have gained popularity, special in Islamic countries where the concept of interest free Islamic finance products appeals to the public such as in Pakistan, India, Bangladesh, Bosnia, and Herzegovina and some African countries.

Under BARKAT Loan, 15 borrowers were identified and given cheques of PKR 30 thousands each after completing the process, trying to visible reduction in poverty. BARKAT model entails a zero interest. It uses the value of social collateral whereby members of a group act as collateral for each other, decreasing the risk of default.

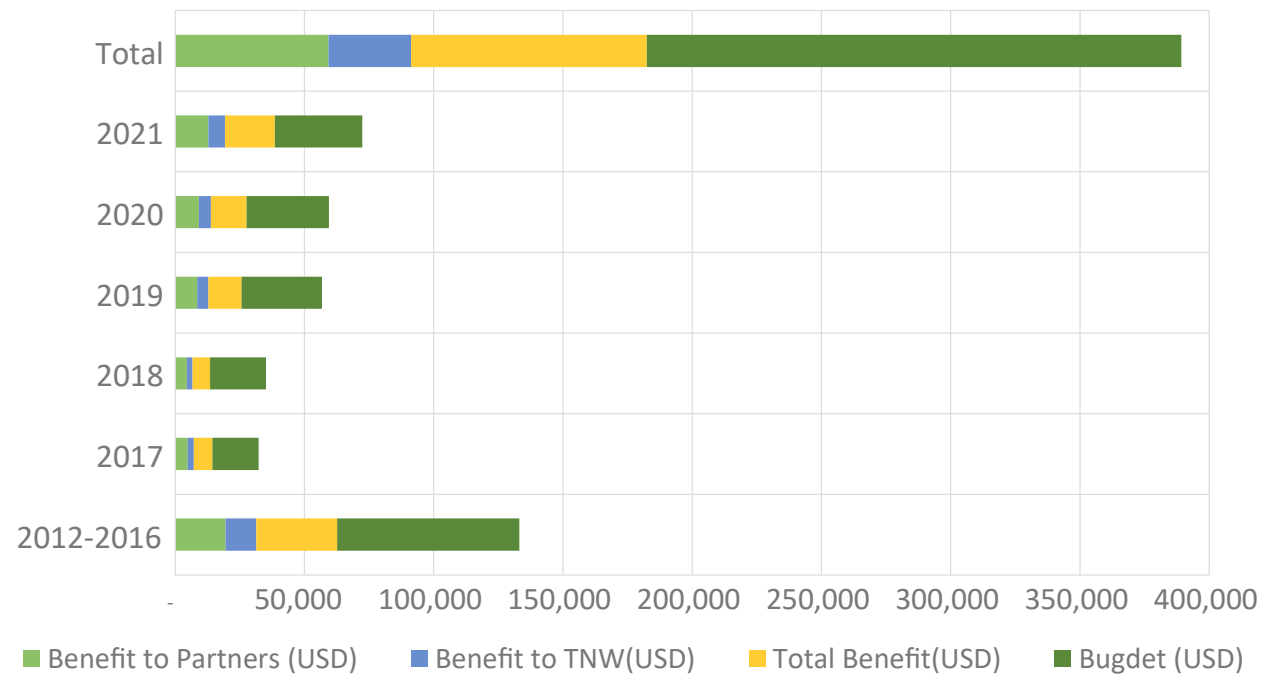
We have coupled this scheme with BARKAT Mudarabah Model that covers all administrative and service expenses.

Eligibility Criteria of Borrowers

- Age been 18 to 60 years
- Individuals from households on Score of 0-40 on Poverty Score Card
- Valid National Identity Card (CNIC)
- Resident of targeted union council of the district
- Economically viable business plan

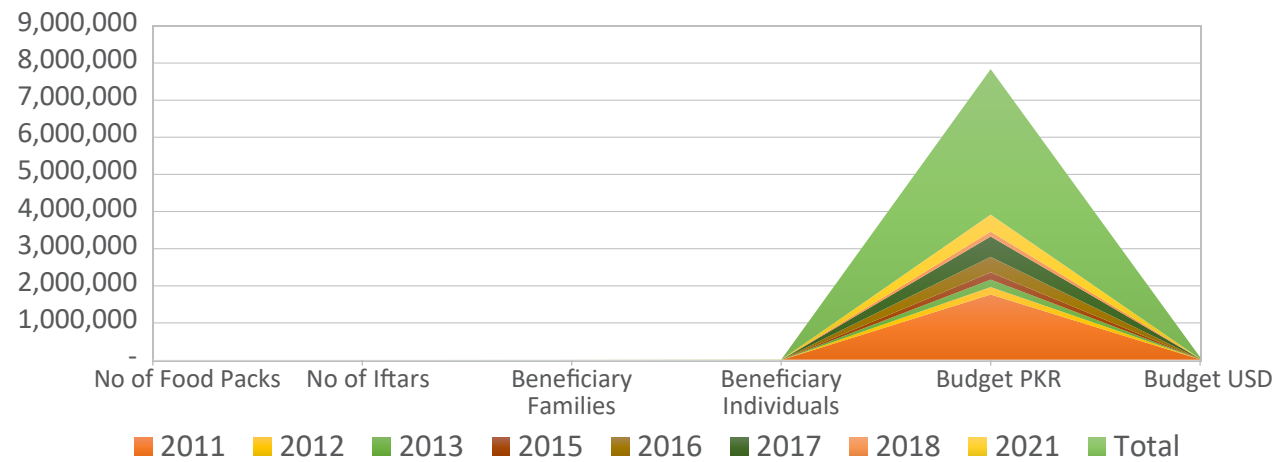


RAMADAN KAREEM



The blessed month of Ramadan brings mercy and blessings upon the Muslim families. Every Ramadan since 2010, The NGO World Foundation in collaboration with Deniz Fenri works on Special Ramadan Programs. Ramadan donations from donor organization help us distribute food packs to impoverished families and provide Iftar for orphaned children and poor families. Since The NGO World Foundation was established, every Ramadan, TNWF – GIFT has been distributing food packs (up to 20-25 Kilos) to impoverished families across Pakistan. These food packs can feed an entire family for a whole month. The TNWF team makes every effort to ensure the food packs are locally sourced which means these food packs not only help families during Ramadan – but also provide sustainable means of living after Ramadan too.

Allah says in the Qur'an: "It is neither their flesh nor their blood that reaches Allah; it is your piety that reaches Him." (Qur'an 22:37)

The act of Qurbani (Udhiya) is to commemorate the great act of worship offered by the Prophet Ibrahim (AS), in Islamic terms means the slaughtering of an animal with the intention of getting close to Allah (SWT) by giving some or all of the meat to the poor and undeserved families.

To include the poor in happy moments of Eid al Adha, every year since 2011, The NGO World Foundation with support of Deniz Feneri organizes the Qurbani Program, slaughter the animals according to the shri'ah principals and provide quality meat to gifts to the deserving families.

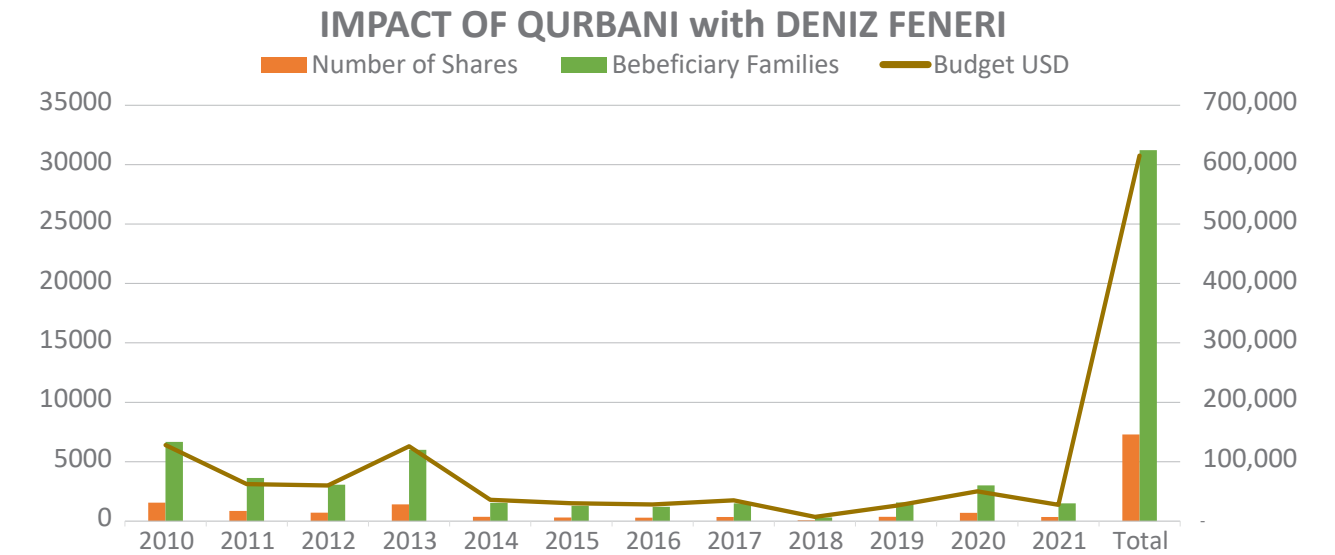

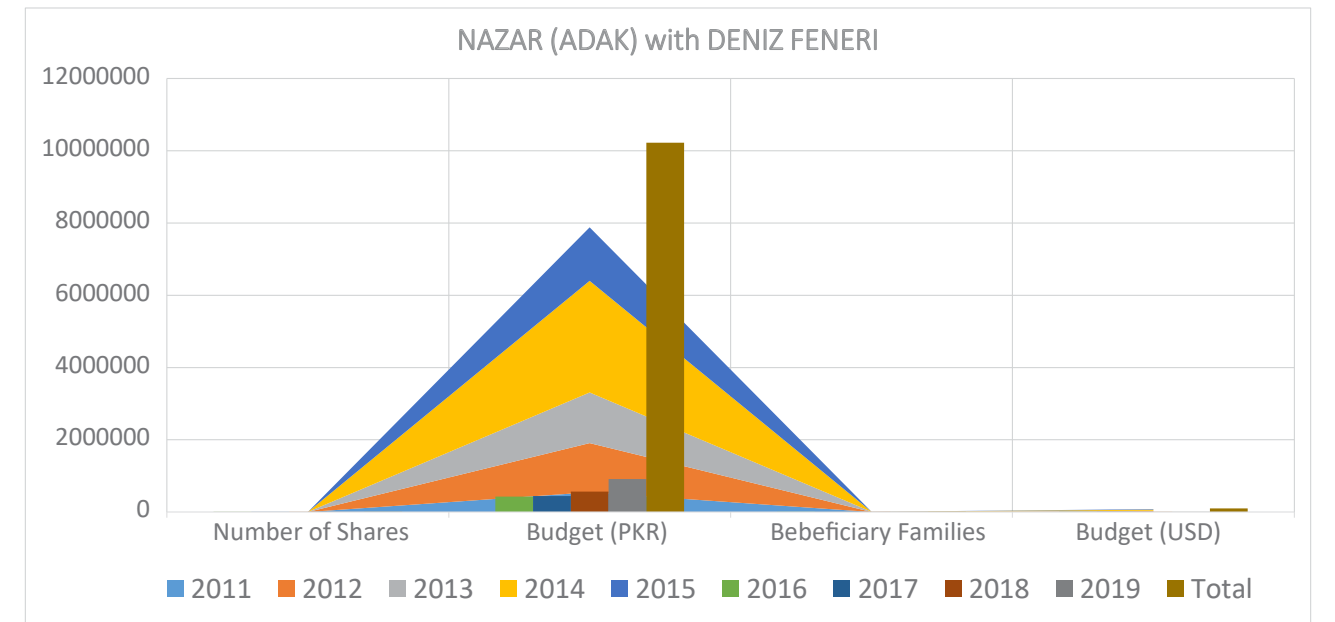

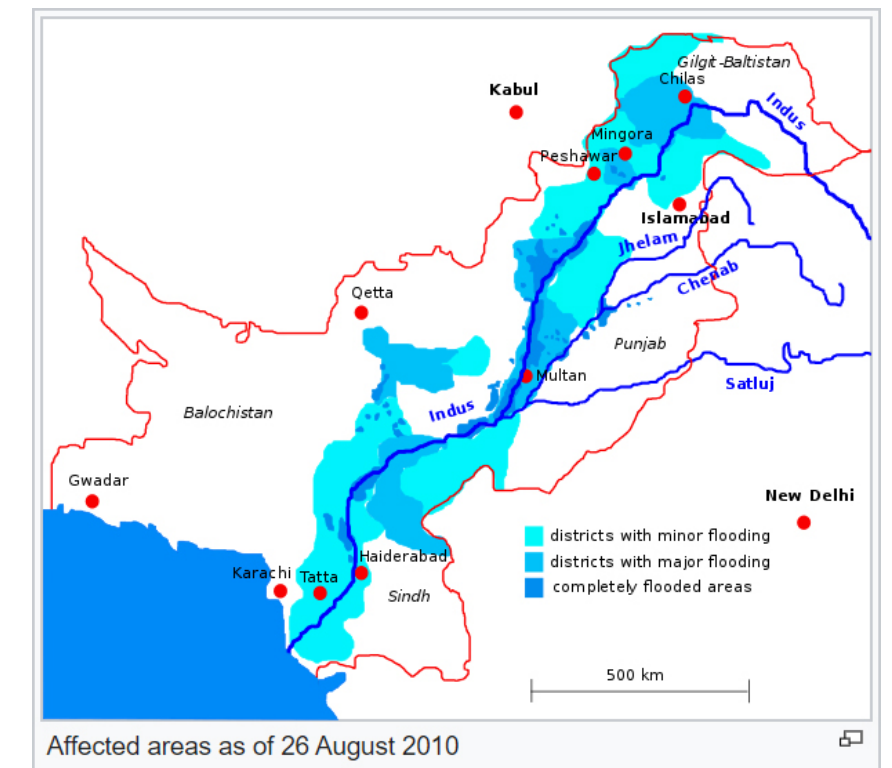

2010 Flood



The 2010 monsoon flood disaster in Pakistan was massive and unprecedented, killing more than 1,700 persons, affecting over 20 percent of the land area and more than 20 million people, causing loss of billions of dollars through damages to infrastructure, housing, agriculture and livestock and other family assets. Essential infrastructure including roads, bridges and markets has been severely damaged and many remain impassable. According to a UN survey that 10.1 million people were in need of shelter and humanitarian assistance. The number of people requiring food assistance to support recovery and rehabilitation is



estimated 3.6 million. More than 1.1 million houses were completely destroyed or made un-liveable and more than 2 million hectares of standing crops were damaged or lost. The flood had a severe impact on people's homes, livelihoods and assets. Most people do not know when they would be able to resume their livelihoods.

Delegation of Deniz Feneri visited flood affected areas of Layyah and Muzaffar Garh districts. The visit was facilitated by the official of The NGO World Foundation. During the visit both teams witnessed the miseries and hardships of rural communities particularly women and children. A detailed need assessment survey was also conducted by The NGO World Foundation team and were submitted to Deniz Feneri. On 29th October 2010, both parties signed a mutual agreement for implementation of the proposed projects in response to lessen the sufferings of people in need

Restoration of Home Based Carpet Weaving Industry



The floods has caused a significant loss to poverty reduction efforts and would result in poverty-increase and vulnerability of affected population. The areas affected by floods were consistently lagging behind in terms of socioeconomic and educational indicators as compared to the areas unaffected by the floods. The loss of infrastructure and livelihood sources pushed them behind further. The people who most affected, were predominantly small farmers and unskilled labourers.

TNWF team identified in a survey that in Layah district flood had destroyed 263 units of small scale household

While visiting the project Restoration of Household Carpet Weaving Units", president of Deniz Feneri expressed his feelings, "seeing this project I am happy that we have done something".

During floods 2010, Property was badly affected with 42 percent of houses completely destroyed. 19 percent heavily damaged and 28 percent lightly damaged. Only 9 percent of houses remained escape from damages.

carpet industry putting livelihood of dependent families under severe stress. TNWF designed a project for rehabilitation of this homebased cottage industry. The Deniz Feneri funded project focused on the revival of this small industry to restore their source of livelihood. The NGO World Foundation successfully completed the project for restoration of primary source of income of affected families by constructing the sheds and providing other related facilities.

Case Study



(Shaista Supports her Family)

Ms. Shaista of village Tali Musa with her brother was helping her parents by using their small unit of carpet weaving installed a room that was the only bedroom for the whole family. After helping her mother in kitchen she was used to work (carpet weaving) for 4-5 hours daily and at the end of month family was having a reasonable amount to sustain their livelihood.

One day water of Flood 2010 entered their village and Shaista's family was shifted to a safer place. After few days when they came back they saw their room demolished and only source of income "Carpet weaving unit" destroyed. It was difficult time for the family. They not only lost their



TNWF distributed 230,000 (356 types) relief items among the 7711 affected families at 72 locations of Southern Punjab districts Layyah and Muzaffar Garh, ensuring women participation on equal terms in distributions and their management.

only shelter but also the source of income. Meanwhile TNWF team visited that village to collect data and witnessed the hardships of Shaista's family and submitted recommendations to support them immediately. The NGO World Foundation with support of Deniz Feneri built a permanent shelter for this vulnerable family and helped them reinstall their carpet weaving unit. Shaista's family was much happy after its completion restoring their work.

Relief Items Distribution



In an emergency situation, families often flee with little more than the clothes they are wearing and consequently find themselves displaced without any personal belongings. In addition to food, they urgently need certain non-food items to survive, including items for shelter (tents, plastic sheeting, blankets, sleeping mats), cooking (stoves, pots, fuel), health and sanitation (buckets, soap, jerry cans, sanitary cloths, mosquito nets). Same happened during floods 2010 when thousands of families of southern Punjab lost their shelters and other important things of daily use.

To respond the situation, TNWF received three containers of food and non-food items from Deniz Feneri and started distributions of relief items in different camps and villages. Major items include kitchen accessories, health & hygiene kits, blankets, clothes, shoes, beds, carpets, stationary, school bags, jackets and many other important things.

TNWF Managed to deliver these daily use items at the door step of affected people by maintaining the discipline and keeping their dignity.



Constructions of Permanent Shelters



According to **NDMA** Pakistan in floods disaster **1,744,471** houses were damaged affecting population of **20,184,550**. In only Punjab province **497,700** houses were damaged affecting 6 million people. In our target district of Layyah, affected population was **405,258** and Muzaffargarh affected population was **1,044,759**.

TNWF designed two separate projects:

Two Rooms Shelter: In Layyah district, these are complete homes comprising of two bedrooms, veranda, kitchen and bathroom. **30** Target beneficiaries were most needy and vulnerable families especially, shelter less widows, orphans, disables or poor parents with large number of children particularly girls.

Single Room Shelter: In this category, TNWF provided single room construction material to **100** affected communities of districts Muzaffargarh. During the survey of shelter-less people in UC Kotla Haji Shah of district Layyah, TNWF team identified a family headed by Mr. Allah Dad, an old man with his three wives and 18 children was living in three separately fixed tents and bearing severe winter. TNWF took initiative and constructed a complete home for this vulnerable family along with provision of required WASH facilities.

Model Village

Sobaywala was a village of UC Kotla Haji shah of District Layyah comprising of 500 families. During the devastating floods 2010 almost half of the populations lost their homes along with land due to erosion. Affected families were living in borrowed homes of landlords where they were continuously under mental and social stress especially

Total 100 sheds for selected beneficiaries were rebuilt, restoring the livelihood of around 400 families.



women and children were facing hardships. TNWF identified such families and resettled them. The houses were built at Kukar Wala like a small village with all necessary requirements including sewerage and clean water. The village was named **“Light House Village”** to compliment and acknowledge its donor association Deniz Feneri (Light House Association, Turkey).

Case Study

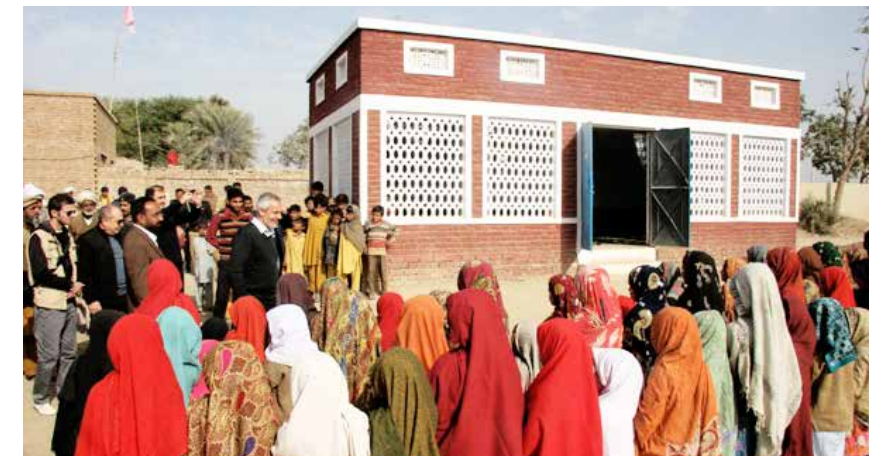


(Allah Dad’ Large Family)

During the survey of shelter less people in UC Kotla Haji Shah of district Layyah The NGO World Foundation team identified a family headed by Mr. Allah Dad, comprising of 22 members. Old man with his three wives and 18 children was living in three separately fixed tents and bearing severe winter. His all assets and house were destroyed. He was unable to reconstruct a suitable shelter for his huge family. was suffering climatic hazards and social stresses. With Deniz Feneri support, TNWF constructed a complete home for this family along with all required WASH facilities.

With the collaborative intervention, TNWF was succeeded to restore the NCHD feeder schools to facilitate 1225 children to continue their education.

Rehabilitation of Feeder Schools



Floods 2010 affected educational facilities badly. “It could be months before affected children can get back to school. This is both because of the impact of floods on families and on the school buildings. Those in better shape are being used as relief camps and may not be vacant for a long time,” an education department official in Layyah, who asked not to be named, told The NGO World Foundation.

Maurizio Guiliano, a spokesman for the UN Office for the Coordination of Humanitarian Affairs (OCHA), told that “8.6 million children under 18 are affected. We are very concerned about them because they are very vulnerable”.

UN Children’s Fund (UNICEF) reported, 1.6 million children have been affected by damaged schools, or because the schools are being used as shelters.

In Layyah TNWF identified that Flood 2010 completely devastated **22** Feeder Schools while creating problem for boys & girls to avail education facility at their door step. These one room schools were established in far off areas by National Commission for human Development in coordination district education department.

TNWF arranged a visit of Deniz Feneri to some of these affected schools. The members of delegation interacted with students, teachers, parents and also government official and discussed the situation in detail. As follow up TNWF conducted assessment survey and prepared a proposal for donor for rehabilitation of these schools.



With generous support of Deniz Feneri, TNWF took the responsibility to rebuild these schools and revive educational journey of the students of far off areas. Along with school building renovations & reconstruction, provision of furniture for teacher & students, stationary and bags was a major contribution.

Case Study



Village Adam Wali with population over 200 families is located right in middle of river Indus near district Layyah. Its situation is like an island. The only access to this village is by local made boats, donkey carts, tractor trolley and horses. At this location there were three feeder schools teaching around 150 students under ten years. These schools were totally demolished during the floods 2010 and students were forced to sit on mud while getting their lessons.

Our team took this hard target and put their efforts to manage the carriage of construction materials and skilled labor. It took around three months to rebuild these three schools. Our team also provided furniture, schools bags and other necessary items to facilitate children in getting education.

Construction of Masjid at Basti Chan



The benefited community expressed their feelings of love, affection, brotherhood and thankfulness to the delegation for this great gift at their village. Imam of the masjid acknowledged the service and prayed for the prosperity, peace and development of Turkish nation.

Village "Basti Chan" of Union Council Ghazi Ghat, District Muzaffargarh was badly hit by floods 2010. Whole population of the village was effected by the flood. After a month when families came back and they found their houses were demolished and they had to live in tents and temporary shelters, facing many problems, the villagers were also feeling risk while offering prayers as the masjid (mosque) of the village was also damaged and destructed.

During the need assessment surveys, TNWF team and Deniz Feneri delegation visited "Basti Chan" and noticed the deteriorated condition masjid along with other destructions all around. On same day the delegation arranged a nazar qurbani program for the affected community and discussed the reconstruction of masjid. Deniz Feneri with coordination of the TNWF team prepared a project proposal for reconstruction the masjid. After the designing and paper work, under supervision of the civil engineer construction was started in 2011 and it took one year to complete the place of peace sufficient for 700 persons.

On project inauguration ceremony, Mr. Ahmed Turan (Professor of Islamic Studies, Sultan Fateh University Istanbul) delivered a speech to the audience coming from Basti Chan and nearby villages. He expressed his views about the importance of Mosques in the Muslim communities and its role in religious and spiritual growth of the worshipers.



Clean Water for Flood Affected Households



According to a research report, as a result of 2010 flood, 3999 water supply schemes and 2842 sanitation schemes were damaged, which resulted in the mixing of sanitation water with water for domestic use. This mixing produced extensive volume of contaminated water which became the basis of the spread of dangerous diseases among the affected community like gastroenteritis, hepatitis, cholera, typhoid fever and diarrhoeal diseases.

To play role to save affected people from water related diseases, The NGO World Foundation proposed a project to Deniz Feneri "Provision of Biosand Water Filters".

A bucket of contaminated water is poured into the top of the biosand filter. The water simply flows through the filter and is collected in another storage container at the base of the spout. A biological layer (often called the biolayer) of slime, sediment and microorganism develops at the sand surface. Pathogens and suspended material are removed through various physical and biological processes that occur in the biolayer and sand.

When water is flowing through the filter, oxygen is supplied to the biolayer by the dissolved oxygen in the water. During

TNWF with support of WHO (World Health Organization) took 250 water samples from the affected areas of Layyah and Muzaffargarh districts to assess the biological contamination in drinking water at the identified locations of both districts. According the reports of WHO and PCRWR 62% of the water samples were found bacteriological contaminated.

pause times, when the water is not flowing, the oxygen is obtained by diffusion from the air. If the standing water layer is kept shallow, enough oxygen is able to pass through to the microorganisms to keep them alive and effective.

The identification of the solution was based on a 6-month study carried out by Stauber et al (2006) in the Dominican Republic during 2005-06, which was the first health impact study to be done on the household biosand filter.

WASH & Health

TNWF with support of Deniz Feneri completed following initiatives in WASH sector in flood affected areas of Southern Punjab districts of Pakistan.

Latrines and Hand Pumps: In district Layyah, 22 permanent latrines with essential sanitation were

The NGO World Foundation provided Biosand water filters to 1000 flood affected families of district Layyah and Muzaffargarh along with necessary training of installation and proper use. The project helped the beneficiaries to fetch safe drinking water at their own house.



constructed in schools with missing facilities. Hand pumps were also installed. These interventions facilitated the poor young students to have proper sanitation and drinking water source. In Basti Light House Layyah, TNWF built 30 latrines and laid underground low cost sanitation system.

Awareness Raising



Our WASH team continuously remained active in raising awareness for proper health, hygiene and sanitation among the illiterate affected communities. Purpose was to keep these people safe from diseases. TNWF in collaboration with National Commission for Human Development (NCHD) established **Adult Literacy Centers** in Khanewal and Layyah districts. **175** female learners were enrolled to learn reading and writing skills.

Free Health Services



During and after the floods affected people especially women and children faced serious health issues. It was routine activity of TNWF to hold medical camps in flood areas with provision of free checkup & free medicines to the poor patients. Thousands got benefited and were treated with this humble health care intervention.

Wheat Flour Distribution



During floods 2010, affected families lost their stored wheat. As wheat flour is main food for the affected people so it was big nutritional problem for them to face. Keeping fact in view, TNWF distributed 15000 KG of wheat flour among 750 affected families

Sharing Eid Greetings

Eid is a Muslim festival celebrated all over the world. TNWF team celebrated Eid days among the disaster affected people and distributed gifts among most vulnerable and neglected segments of society especially women and children. During 2010 floods a vast majority of population in the flood affected area was homeless and needed our support to move on. At



the time of sheer distress and desperation TNWF distributed Eid gifts amongst the flood affected families and celebrated the event along with to express its solidarity, commitment and brotherhood.



Marriage Gifts to Affected Brides

It is our local tradition that poor village women collect dowry (Jahez) items since the birth of girls so that they may not face any problem at the time of her marriage. During the floods many girls whose marriage dates were already fixed lost their jahez. Their parents were under severe stress to arrange it again. Feeling the need TNWF prepared jahez packages for 30 brides. These packages were delivered at their home without damaging their integrity. Packages contain 28 different items including clothes, shoes, blankets, mattress, kitchen accessories etc.

Food Packs Distribution



In 2014 flood, miseries, food shortage infrastructure damaged, destruction of houses, loss of livestock, crops destroyed and health issues were observed in the flood affected areas of Jhang, Multan and Muzaffargarh districts.

TNWF team as immediate response distributed 1000 food packs including 3000 biscuits packs, 4000 milk packs and 1000 clean drinking water bottles to children.



Inauguration of response to disaster projects



A delegation of Deniz Feneri including secretary general, board members, journalists and philanthropists, led by Mr. Mehmet Cengez, the president visited Pakistan to inaugurate the projects completed by The NGO World Foundation under RESPONSE program launched after floods 2010. The projects related to shelter, drinking water, livelihood and education were completed in restoration and rehabilitation phases. The beneficiaries of these projects were from affected areas of district Layyah and Muzaffargarh.

On the first day of the visit, President, General Secretary and Board Members of Deniz Feneri visited The NGO World Foundation office in Multan where Executive Director of The NGO World Foundation, Mr. Zafar Iqbal welcomed showed them the projects documentary and presented details of the projects. Mr. Zafar Iqbal also handed over concerned documents (project completion reports, goods receiving forms, official MOUs & letters, financial statements and details of beneficiaries).

On second day the delegation;

- Visited newly constructed Feeder School Baseera (Layyah) and delivered gifts to the students.
- Inaugurated newly established small village (Basti Turki) and delivered handing over letters to the beneficiaries.
- Visited Basti Chandia Khan to inaugurate the project on Revival of Carpet Industry. Carpet weaving community weaved a small carpet piece with the logo of Deniz Feneri.

Mr. Mushtaq Anjum (Deputy Commissioner Layyah) along with officials of district participated and acknowledged



the efforts of both organizations regarding relief and rehabilitation of flood affected people. He presented letter of thanks & acknowledgement to General Secretary of Deniz Feneri on behalf of Director General, Provincial Disaster Management Authority (PDMA) Punjab.

President of Deniz Feneri, Mr. Mehmet Cengez presented a shield to Executive Director of The NGO World Foundation to acknowledge the hard work and quality services provided to the people in need.

Food Support to Earthquake Victims 2015



The magnitude 7.5 earthquake that struck Badakshan Province, Afghanistan on 26 October, 2015, also rocked Pakistan ruthlessly. After need assessment, TNWF with support of deniz Feneri planned to distribute food packs among 300 affected families. In Shangla district, the packs were distributed directly among the 200 selected families based on their vulnerability, whereas in Bajour the government restrictions were followed and the food packs were handed over to FATA Disaster Management Authority.

Cataract Surgery Camps



Considerable efforts are underway worldwide to minimize the huge backlog of curable blindness. The reasons including lack of awareness, appropriate technology & human resources and poor socioeconomic status. Most of the people have no access to basic health. Eye care services are not available. People aged between 40-70 years are suffering from eye diseases which leads to partial or permanent blindness.

The NGO World Foundation in collaboration with Deniz Feneri (Turkey) successfully implemented a cataract surgery project (2018-20) for the elimination of avoidable blindness, which particularly focuses on:

Objectives of Project

- To create adequate eye care facilities particularly in underprivileged areas. (clinic or monthly camps)
- To implement specific programs to control the major causes of blindness and eye issues
- To intensified surgical intervention for cataract (opacification of the lens), which at present accounts for half of all blindness.
- To provide of spectacles.
- To make it affordable high quality eye care services would be provided

Benefits of Project

- It provided adequate eye care facilities particularly in underprivileged areas

Models of projects (shelter, biosand filter, and schools), products, brochures and other related material were displayed.

Visitors, students, humanitarian & NGO's professionals and academic persons took interest and asked about the details of projects. Chairman CPDM and organizer of the event, Mr. Mushtaq Jan visited the stall and appreciated our efforts for relief and rehabilitation of flood affected communities. The NGO World Foundation was awarded a shield on participating in the event by Chairman CPDM and its profile was included in the directory of exhibitors.

(Ms. Meeram got back both eyes)

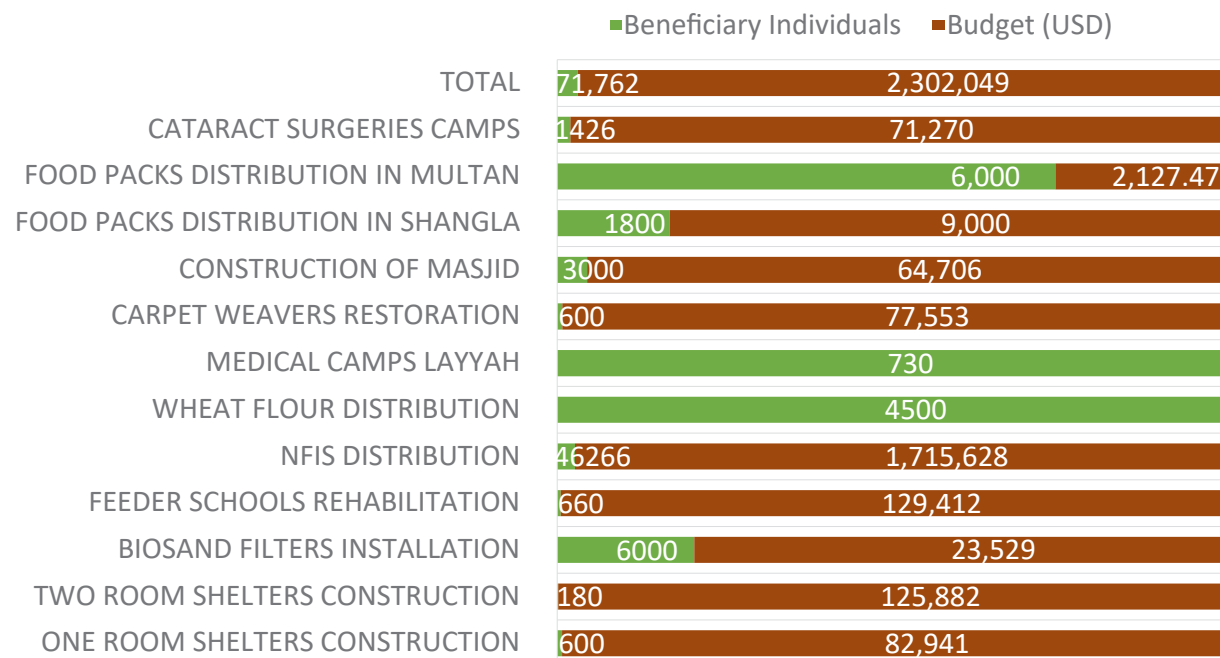
24 years old and mother of 2 children "Meeram" belonging to a poor family lost her vision from both eyes. Living in far off areas of Thar Desert her family was unable to afford the expensive surgery. She was in difficult situation and taking care of two children was challenging for her.



In 2019, The NGO World Foundation with support of Deniz Feneri organized a free cataract surgeries camp in district Umarkot. With support of district head-quarter hospital, large number of patients from near and far were participated and got facilitated including Meeram. After examining Meeram eyes, surgeons were hopeful that the surgery would brought her eye sight back and they were succeeded.

Required Initiatives for Daughter's Access



Women outnumber men in Pakistan and considered to be relatively bigger human resource, but the current plight of the country shows that we are lagging behind to empower which is the larger segment of our society.

The gateway to a collective development and individual success is only through education and income generation. Keeping in view the prevailing scenario RIDA program was designed and launched in 2012 with the purpose to;

- Provide educational opportunities where there is no access to education.
- Raise awareness about personal development, social issues and life skills.
- Impart income-generating skills to women/girls in need, enabling them to sustain their livelihood

RIDA aims to encourage candidates aspiring to improve their lives with the vision that education and economic stability helps women earn a place for themselves in their downtrodden families.

Women and girls are empowered when they are able to access the opportunities available to them without limitations and restrictions such as in education and profession and RIDA strives for this. RIDA enjoyed the support of Deniz Feneri to expand the actions of raising the status of women through education, raising awareness, literacy, training and skills.

In order to provide, access to education to women, The NGO World Foundation (TNWF) conducted a need assessment surveys and meetings with the community in the target area and concluded that parents are afraid to send their daughters to nearby cities to get higher education because they cannot afford the expenses of further education after matriculation. So, a need was felt to establish an educational facility to provide opportunity for girls to continue their education.

Mahnisial is a village between Khanewal and Multan with population over 50000 when surrounded areas are included. SSC/Matriculation education was available to the girls there and after completing matriculation only a few affording families could send their daughters to the nearby cities for getting higher education while poor girls used to sit at home although having talent and hope in their mind.

Feeling the need, The NGO World Foundation with participation of local stakeholders took an important initiative and established RIDA centre to provide these females an opportunity to continue their educational journey in their access with quality and affordability. At RIDA center, girls are getting education above matriculation level with TNWF contribution. Some of these students are those who have restarted their education being terminated the process after completing 10th class few years back due to unavailability of local facility and resources to move to nearby cities for this purpose.

The special guest of the function was Mrs. Shahida Malka, Member Punjab Assembly and Mr. Zafar Iqbal, Chairman, The NGO World Foundation congratulated the college and Ms. Ramsha Khalil for their great achievement.



Vocational and IT Technical Centers for Women



TNWF established the vocational centers especially for the village girls at different locations (Bolay Wala, Basti Chawan, Kohi Wala, Ghareebabad, Shahdra, Qadirpur Ran, Ghareebabad) where it was observed need of providing facilities for the women. After different surveys and meetings with the community it was decided to establish RIDA Vocational & ICT Training Centers with following objectives in mind;

- To promote awareness and raise literacy
- To deliver income generating skills to the girls & women
- To create link between skilled women and market
- To provide facility of ICT lab
- Awareness sessions and tarbi'ah classes
- Mother and child care awareness

Our Trained Girls prepared Total school bags 3000 that were gifted to our ZEST students in Karachi.

Tarbi'ah teacher delivered the lectures according to the syllabus of Islamic Tarbi'ah.

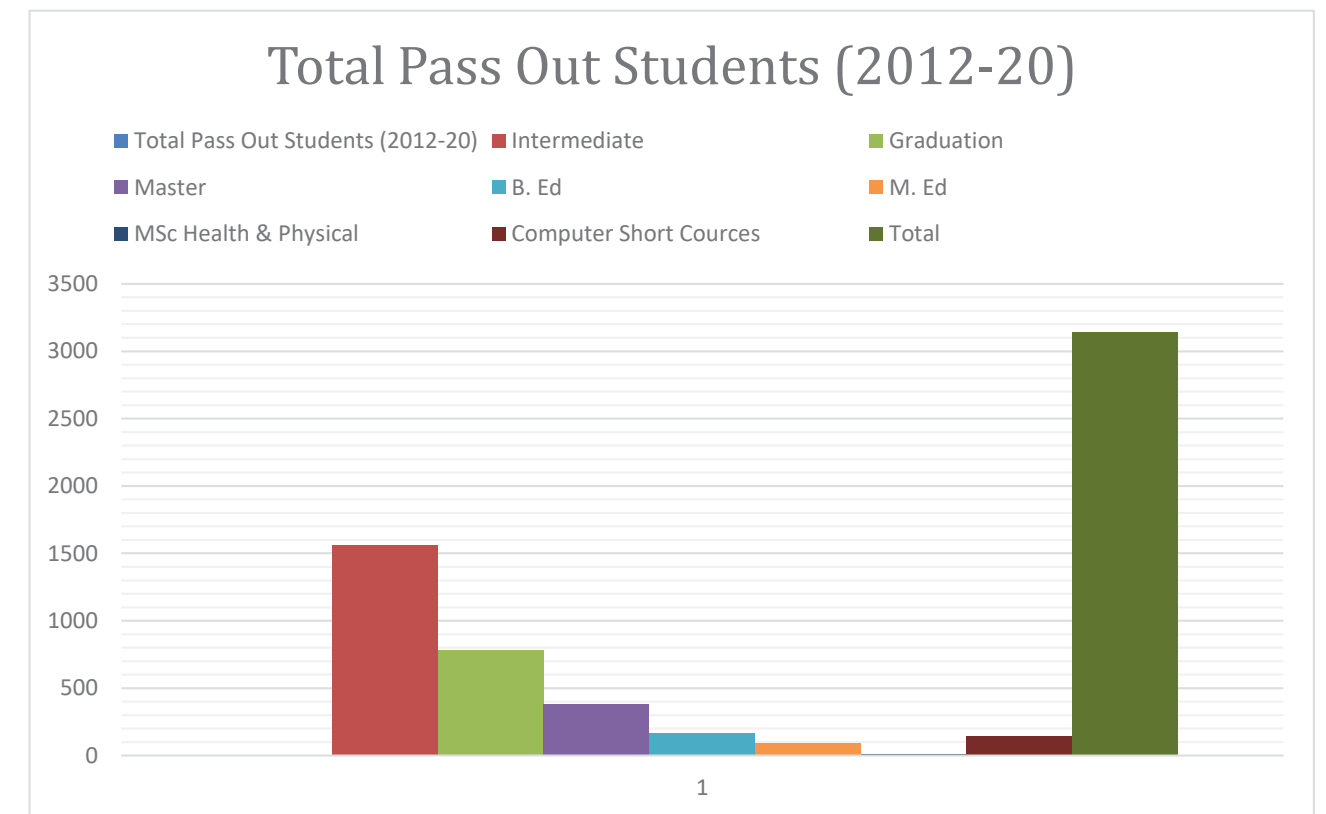
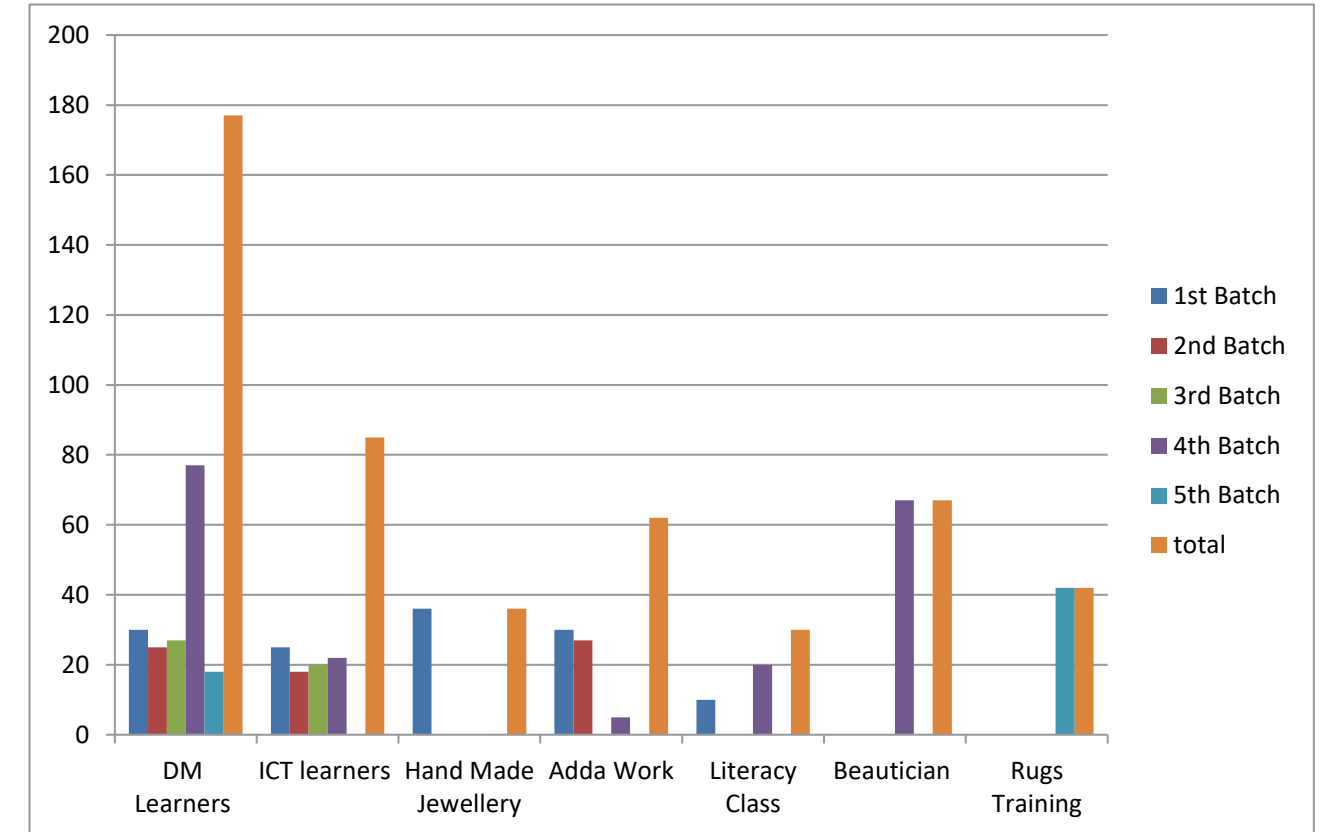

Sharing Qurbani and Nazar with Poor



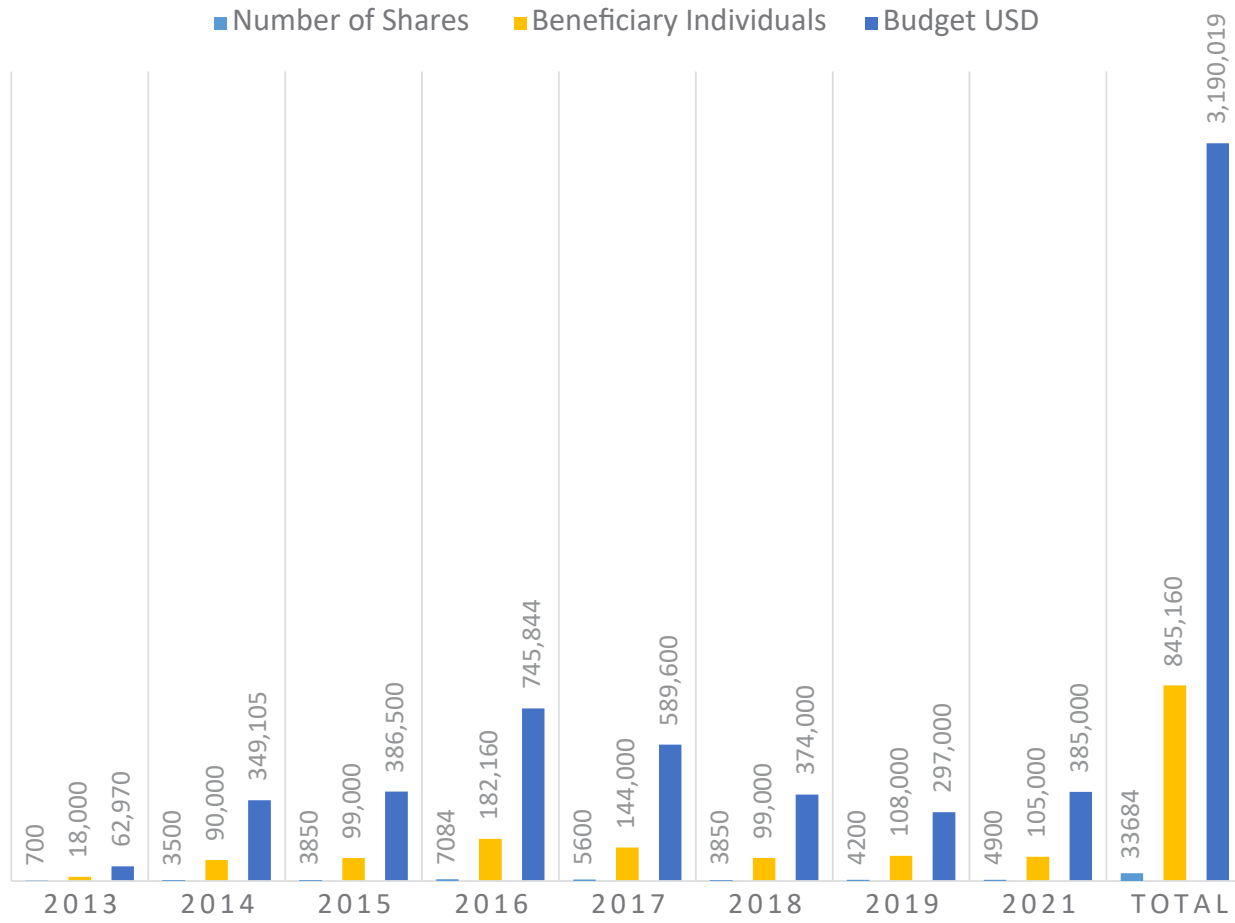

ZEST is low-cost non-formal school system designed to take out of school children (7-11 years of age) back to the formal educational system by completing their five years primary education in only three years instead of five years.

Establishment Process of ZEST Schools and Functions



Below is a list of some of the major activities showing the process adopted for establishment of ZEST schools and the standard criteria followed for each activity.

- 1 Community Mobilization:** Individual contact, small group and large group meetings or Broad Based Community Meetings (BBCM)
- 2 Area selection:** Primary selection of UCs and villages on the basis of target population/ available educational facilities and literacy rate.
- 3 Survey:** Identifying eligible students, potential teachers, and selection of suitable rooms/ spaces for ZEST schools through door to door survey.
- 4 Student's selection:** Select 35-40 students for each ZEST school (out of school boys & girls) with the age group of 7-11.
- 5 Teacher's selection:** Female teachers were preferred, with Educational qualification preferably of Intermediate. The teacher must be willing to attend all teacher training courses including monthly refreshers, should be residents of the same community, having acceptance in community, agree to run her classes everyday (for 4 hrs for 6 days in a week in winter and summer), and visit students' houses if necessary.



29 October every year, ZEST students marked the anniversary of the Republic of Turkey. Happy Republic Day!



- 6. Space for school:** Free spaces to schools were provided by the community and ZEST team tried to find spaces fulfilling such points. (Normally the size of school room should be 14'X18' sq. feet. The rooms are well ventilated (with sufficient light and air) having proper arrangement of toilet facilities for the students.
- 7. Opening of ZEST Schools:** Facilities to teacher and students
8. Syllabus adopted belonged to govt. Text book board or NFE specialized syllabus and syllabus to be covered in 03 years
9. Grooming of students by practical activities, role play and terbi'ah lessons
10. Days Celebration and Awareness raising among students
11. Regular Capacity Building of staff and activists
12. Regular Exams, class evaluations and monitoring visits

100 ZEST Non-Formal Schools for Out of School Children

2016-2019 Karachi Pakistan

Teaching thousands of children in slums of Karachi by opening 100 non-formal schools.

Education is considered to be pillar of countries in the world. Through education, literacy levels increases, and so the quality of human resources.



The vision behind ZEST program is to impart quality education and transfer of life skills to students and to engage them into practical life with full confidence



Due to the needs of the education most governments in Pakistan are currently engaging with NGO sector to support provision of better education at larger scale at provincial level.

It helps in making the process sustainable, by bringing together all the stakeholders, and deliver quality education together.

The NGO World Foundation under ZEST Program take part in promoting education is by establishing Non-Formal schools especially in marginalized areas. It is evident that in remote parts of Pakistan, children do not go to school because the schools are not there.

Sindh is the second largest province of Pakistan in terms of population and is facing problem of Out of School Children (OOSC), there are currently more than 4 million Out of School Children present in the province. To facilitate Out of School Children, The NGO World Foundation (TNWF) with support of Turkiye Diyanet Vakfi executed ZEST Schools Project in slum areas of Korangi and Malir Districts. During surveys conducted in targeted areas, the major problems identified were; non availability of proper schooling for children in the community, no employment opportunities and existence of acute poverty.



As a first step. So in this way, initially 25 ZEST Non-Formal Education Centers were opened and after a year the figure was reached to 100 centers.



According to the model, out of school children where economically poor and unable to afford school charges, who were before attached with the nearby Islamic Madaris with free education. Now, can have access to basic primary education and learning the Quran

During consultation meetings, it was mutually decided by TNWF team, local community notables, high ups and donor organization (Turkiye Diynet Vakfi) that some school projects should be launched.

Furthermore, the community members' active involvement made the task easy as they offered to facilitate the children by providing 01 room at their home to support the cause and future of children. Moreover, requirement like sitting mats, class books, stationary, pens, chairs, cupboard for the female teachers were provided by the donor organization.

Additionally, an awareness campaign was also launched for the women and children of the project area. For this ZEST teachers were trained to deliver sessions to the target groups on various aspects of their daily life including health & hygiene, mother & child care, effective parenting and life skills.



Final Assessment of ZEST Students



The final assessment was carried by Government of Sindh Non-Formal Basic Education Department; all the students who were enrolled for final assessment were gathered at examination centers and they successfully cleared the assessment, as per criteria provided by Government of Sindh (Education Department).

Appreciations for ZEST School's Teachers



18 May 2019.SALAM TEACHER ceremony was graced by the participation of a delegation from Turkiye Diyanet Vakf (Donor of ZEST Project Karachi) and Director General, Literacy and Non-formal Education, School Education and Literacy Department, Government of Sindh.



Financial Literacy for ZEST Students



TNWF and National Institute of Banking and Finance (NIBAF) entered into an understanding to join hands in implement National Financial Literacy Program for Youth (A Project of State Bank of Pakistan (SBP). Basic aim of program was to impart essential financial education to Pakistani youth and school going children for strengthening of their money management skills and understanding of financial matters. TNW Foundation has conducted TOTs with all ZEST teachers and training sessions with 3000 students and provided orientation on financial literacy.

ZEST as Integrated Model of Community Development



ZEST Project is not only an educational project, but it enriched with number of interventions to make it an integrated model of community development. It contributes as:



- NFE model to teach out of school children;
- Teachers earned salary at home based activity (Poverty Reduction);
- It empowered the women;
- It contributed towards child protection;
- It reduced child labor;
- It contributed towards better health by raising awareness and free medical camps;
- Orientation to students and community on environmental protection;
- Social support by provision of gifts on different occasions.

ZEST Contributed to society on the whole through actions like;

- Targeted youth and managed training workshops on various topics;
- Engaged the youngsters in volunteer activities;
- Organized the community activists and provided them with social mobilization skills;
- Networked them with service providers and technical training institutes.

Graduation Ceremony and Certificate Distribution of ZEST Schools



Director Literacy & NFE department Government of Sindh appreciated the efforts of The NGO World Foundation team and great support from Turkey Diyanet Vakfi for proving education to out of school children.

On completion of academic session (2016-2019) of ZEST Non-Formal Schools on December 5th 2019, a graduation and certificates distribution ceremony was organized in Karachi. Minister for Literacy and Non-Formal Education, Government of Punjab, Raja Rashid Hafeez graced the event as chief guest. Secretaries of Literacy & NFE department of Punjab and Sindh provinces were also there to appreciate and acknowledge the successful students.

It was a day of celebration for students who were out of school three years ago, and also The NGO World Foundation (ZEST Project) on bringing them towards books. The achievers including ZEST project team, teachers and even parents were excited to see the amazing product.

Mr. Muhammad Alam Thaeem, Director Literacy & NFE department, Sindh, shared his encouraging remarks and views about ZEST schools. He told that ZEST project has been providing quality education to these students. He added that the ZEST is being considered as a model project on NFE for other organizations and government departments.

Minister along with distinguished guests presented certificates to the young students and appreciated the efforts by all stakeholders towards promoting the culture of education in neglected areas.



Case Study



The five real brothers & sisters at NFE Centre in Karachi are part of ZEST School, they all are of different ages but all are class fellows. This family was looking for provision of quality education and when they came to know about Non-formal ZEST School, two kilometers away from their home (the closest educational facility). They approached team TNWF-ZEST and told that they are interested in getting enrolled in the ZEST NFE center. They all are expected to complete their primary education by next year and later plan to continue their education at secondary level.

This is how, low cost Non-Formal schooling is helping to the underprivileged children living in slums.

January 25, 2020: President of Türkiye Diyanet Foundation visited ZEST Schools Project and interacted with the students and teachers to know about the learning process and outcomes of project being implemented to teach out of school children living in slums.

Mr. Ihsan Acik cut the ribbon to open TNW Community Centre where boys and girls are learning life skills, English language and basic computer. The community centre is also raising awareness amongst the uneducated community about health & hygiene and other related social issues.

Later on, he graced the ceremony arranged to appreciate teachers, students and community activists on their exceptional role in bringing out of school children in ZEST schools to complete their primary education in three years.

Mr. Muhammad Alam Thaheem (Director Literacy and Nonformal Education Department, Government of Sindh) and Talib Sheikh (Additional Director) also joined to acknowledge the work done by The NGO World Foundation. Mr. Alam Thaheem said that ZEST project has played a commendable role to educate the out of school children in slums.



State of poverty: Poverty is considered one of the biggest hindrances in the way of educational journey for students belonging to the families living below poverty line. Poor parents prefer to put their kids on labour and getting support to their kitchen of only a few 100s PKR while feeling kid's schooling a burden.



Dr Muhammad Shahid (Head of Social Work Department Karachi University) congratulated the project team on the successful implementation of project.

Also, Mr. Zafar Iqbal in his welcome speech delivered the note of thanks for generous support by donors and continued guidance & patronage from Directorate of Literacy and Non-formal Education Government of Sindh.

ZEST Model School



Initially TNW-NFE started 100 non-formal centres to cater out of school students equivalent to grade 1 to 5 as capacity of accelerated learning model. After completion of basic primary education of around 2500 children, some

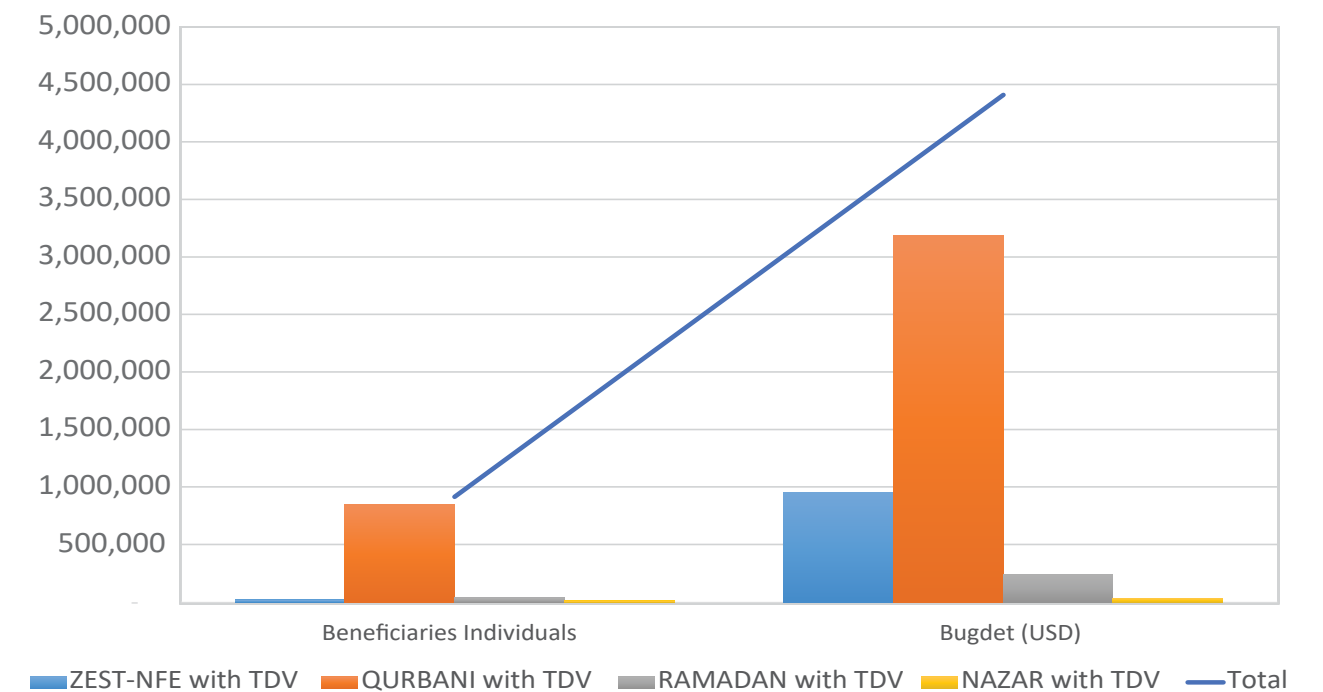


students/learners got admission in government and other private sector schools. Still there were huge number which wasn't able to pursue education after primary- non formal education due to lack of educational facilities around them and poor financial situation of their parents.

In order to cope with this problem TNWF-ZEST with generous support of TDV has established a formal school "ZEST Model High School" for grade 6 to 10.

School management is striving to prepare students with life skills along with academic subjects. Qualified teachers has been appointed to provide quality education to the students. The main success is extracurricular activities and continuous training of teaching staff.

Prosperity with Dignity



BARKAT Project is a scheme/instrument i.e. ethical alternative to poverty alleviation and a special kind of partnership. BARKAT provides domestic cattle (Bulls) by signing an agreement with the poor and low-income families (Household Livestock Farmers) based on specific set of terms and conditions. During the period farmers (partners) take care of cattle (fodder/protection) while implementing organization provide services for animal's health and extension services. Both parties share profit and loss.

Under this project (called as BARKAT Project), The NGO World Foundation provides 100 bulls (calves) to the selected poor livestock farming families (1 or 2 animals per family depending upon their capacity) by signing a mutual agreement based on specific set of terms and conditions according to the MODARABAH principle of Islamic microfinance. For a period of around 8 to 10 months organization provides services like medication and awareness while farming family (known as partner), look after the animals and get benefit out of it at maturity. After the agreed period animals are sold and profit is divided between the beneficiary family and implementing organization according to the terms & conditions of agreement signed. Generally community gets 67% of the total profit. The beneficiary family enjoys the benefit for its sustainability and it is expected their living standard improves while the organization use the principle amount & profit to target other poor families to uplift them.

Overall goal of the project is; to improve the living standard of target vulnerable deserving families by using livestock as a tool of poverty alleviation.



BARKAT is long term program. Planned duration is 8 to 10 months per cycle that will start when the donor signs agreement and then same cycle will be repeated every year and creates chain of beneficiaries.

Barkat Launching with TRC



Under the BARKAT Project, The NGO World Foundation provides 100 bulls (calves) to the selected poor livestock farming families (1 or 2 animals per family depending upon their capacity) by signing a mutual agreement based on specific set of terms and conditions according to the MODARABAH principle of Islamic microfinance. For a period of around 8 to 10 months organization provides services like medication and awareness while farming family (known as partner), look after the animals and get benefit out of it at maturity. After the agreed period animals are sold and profit is divided between the beneficiary family and implementing organization according to the terms &



conditions of agreement signed. Generally community gets 67% of the total profit. The beneficiary family enjoys the benefit for its sustainability and it is expected their living standard improves while the organization use the principle amount & profit to target other poor families to uplift them.

The NGO World Foundation (TNWF) signed an agreement with Turkish Red Crescent (TRCS) for expansion of BARKAT Project in Pakistan. The signing ceremony was held in Islamabad on September 8, 2020. From The NGO World Foundation, Mr. Zafar Iqbal (Chairman) and from Turkish Red Crescent TRCS, Mr. Carlos Camilo CLAVIJOLARTE (Head of Delegation in Pakistan) were the signatory.

Mr. Ibrahim Carlos, said that Turkish people consider the Pakistani nation as their brother and the best friend. Barkat project will continue its work in the region for the eradication of poverty. Mr. Zafar Iqbal said that the Barkat Program is very much successful to alleviate poverty from rural communities and we will continue to reach more and more deserving farmers to help them come out of poverty situations.

Beneficiary farmers also expressed their success stories in their own words, how they are being benefited from this model project.

Through this project we expect visible improvement in income generation, poverty reduction, health, education and overall social development.

1. To enhance the income of beneficiaries by promoting self-employment

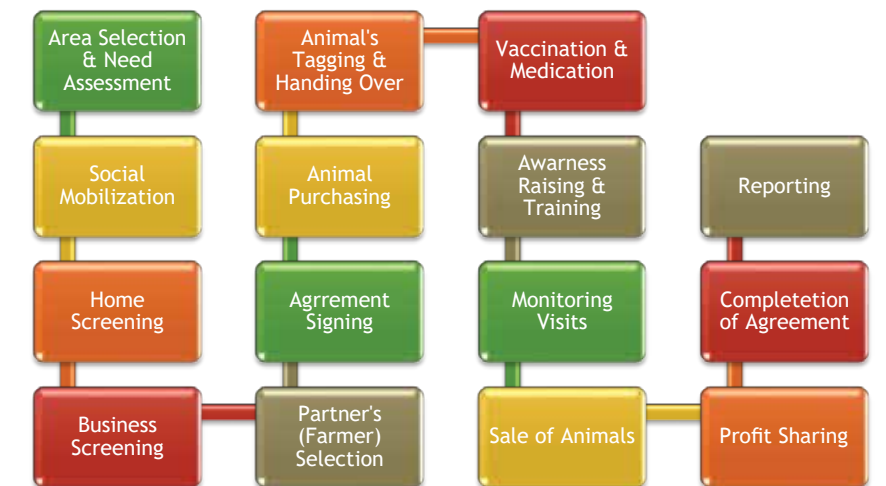

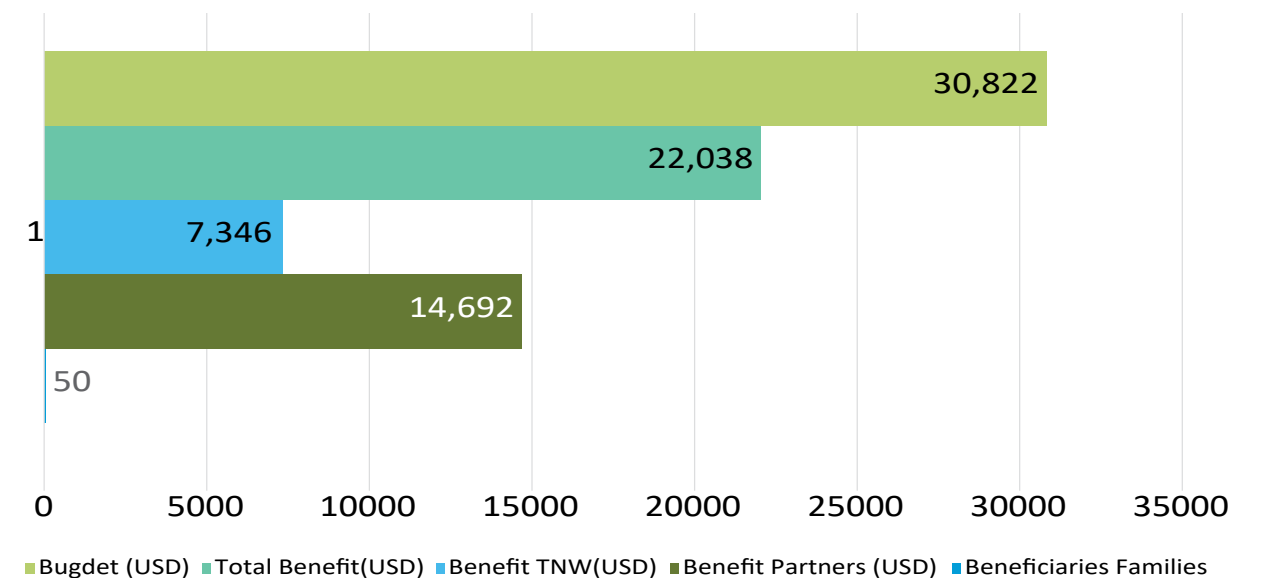
The project will be executed in different villages of districts of province Punjab It may be shifted to any other district of Punjab afterwards.

It will create beneficiaries chain every year with its own resources. TNWF aims to complete at least three cycles of the project and then discuss exit plan with donor.

Support for ZEST Project



The NGO World Foundation with the financial support of Turkish Red Crescent Society (TRCS), Pakistan, renovated the school in short period of 15 days. After the repair and construction work was completed, the renovated and newly built garden were handed over to the school administrators.

Renovation of School



The NGO World Foundation (TNWF) prepared the project for the renovation of the Government Primary School for Boys & Girls at Bangali Para, Karachi which consists 300 students, Renovation including classrooms, toilets, principal & teachers' rooms, garden and white wash to whole building. The school was founded in 1985 but it never undergone a major renovation like this.

Qurbani and Nazar Project



Qurbani/Nazar Program For Orphans, Widows And Poor



It is not their meat nor their blood that reaches Allah: it is your piety that reaches Him: He has thus made them subject to you that ye may glorify Allah for His guidance to you: and proclaim the Good News to all who do right.

The Prophet (saw) was asked once: "What is Qurbani?" The Prophet (saw) replied: "It is the Sunnah of your father Ibrahim (as). For every hair of the Qurbani you receive a reward from Allah (swt)." [Tirmidhi]

Qurbani is the act of offering sacrifice of an animal to Allah (swt) on Eid-al-Adha and is one of the obligatory acts of Hajj. All Muslim adults who are eligible to pay Zakat make the sacrifice. By Qurbani, all Muslims commemorate the Prophet Ibrahim (as) willingness to sacrifice his son for Allah. Muslims observe **Udhiyah/Qurbani** by sharing meat with the less fortunate people.

Since 2019, support from Turk Kizilay, enables us to spread the joy of Eid al Adha! Given the gift of Qurbani (meat) to the needy people including orphans, widows, the elderly people disabled, sick and poor people in Pakistan.

We always try to choose the beneficiaries mostly from refugees and disaster-affected people. To organize the Qurbani Program successfully following activities are planned and executed;

1. Survey to identify most vulnerable and needy families
2. Issuing meat delivery slips
3. Purchase of animals fulfilling all Islamic requirements
4. Proper handling of animals (security & health)

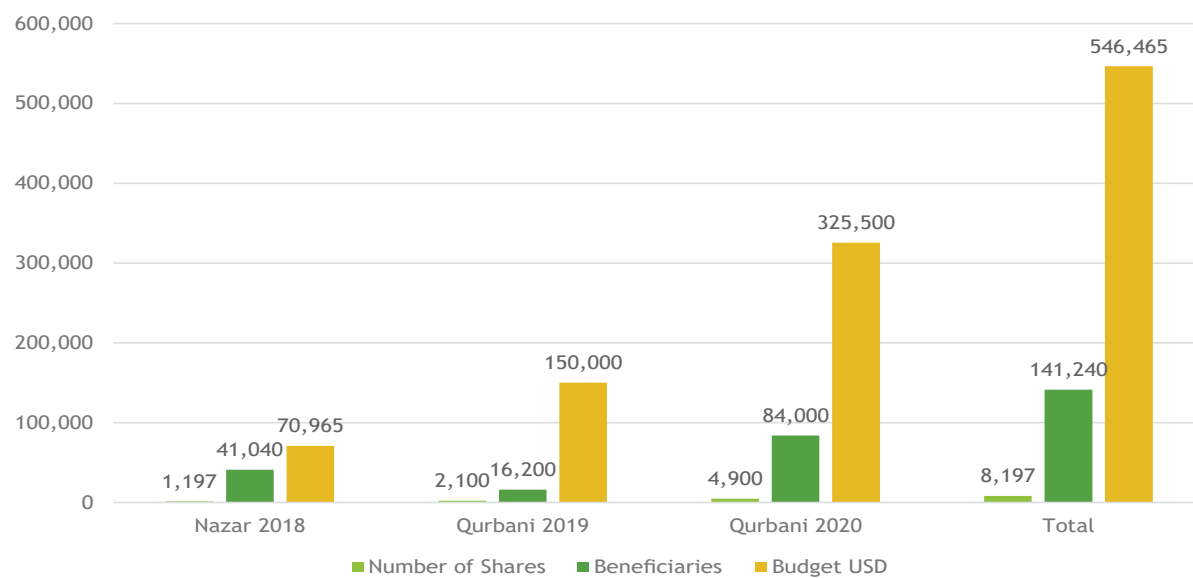

Turk Kizilay to rebuild 118 Year Old Mosque in Jhang



The Turkish Red Crescent has laid the foundation stone for restoring the 118-year-old Hazarat Ibrahim Mosque in a village of Jhang district, Punjab.

The mosque was built by local people in 1901. However, years of neglect have weakened its structure making it dangerous for worshippers praying inside.

Chairman of The NGO World Foundation Mr. Zafar Iqbal proposed this project to the Director General of Turk Kizilay at its headquarter in Ankara Turkey. The project was approved by the board and started execution in October 2019.

This is the only mosque in that village and population of 3000 was forced to pray in open area. Management of the Turk Kizilay realized its need and approved this great gift to the residents of village.

During the ground breaking ceremony, the village representatives honored the Turkish guests with traditional turban and also presented them a model of mosque.

The projects will be completed in a year and inaugurated by the high level officials of Turk Kizilay.

Inauguration of Jamia Masjid Sayyedna Ibrahim

(عَلَيْهِ السَّلَامُ)



The Historical Masjid was constructed in 1901. However, the structure of masjid was weakened making it dangerous for praying inside, therefore was decided by local community on 2017 to demolish it. As a symbol of Pakistan – Türkiye Brotherhood, this state of art was reconstructed by Turkish Red Crescent starting on 20 August 2019 and inaugurated for worship on 10th of March 2021.

The mosque, built in the village of Hokran Chak in Jhang district of Punjab province, was inaugurated by Turkish Red Crescent Secretary General Huseyin Can.

The organization's International Programs and Operations Director Alper Uluca, Turkish Red Crescent Delegation President in Pakistan Ibrahim Carlos Camilo and Zafar Iqbal, Chairman of the NGO World Foundation, also attended the ceremony.





Upon their arrival, the Turkish delegation was warmly welcomed by the local villagers and thanked for the construction of the mosque in their village.

Addressing the opening ceremony, Huseyin Can said it was a great honor to build a mosque in a brotherly Muslim country.

“Hazrat Ibrahim Mosque was built in 1901 and it was demolished in 2017 during the earthquakes in the region,” Can later told Anadolu Agency.

Construction began in October 2019, but its completion was delayed for six months due to the coronavirus outbreak and restrictions in the country.

Can also prayed along with his delegation in the newly built mosque.

The mosque was built on 400 square meters and has a capacity of over 750 worshippers.

A religious seminary was also built on the premises of the mosque for the local children.

“The Turkish nation has not forgotten the friendship of Muslims of the sub-continent,” Can said, referring to their assistance in the Turkish War of Independence.

Turkey has always stood behind their Pakistani brothers and sisters in difficult times of floods and earthquakes, he added.

Blood Donation Camp



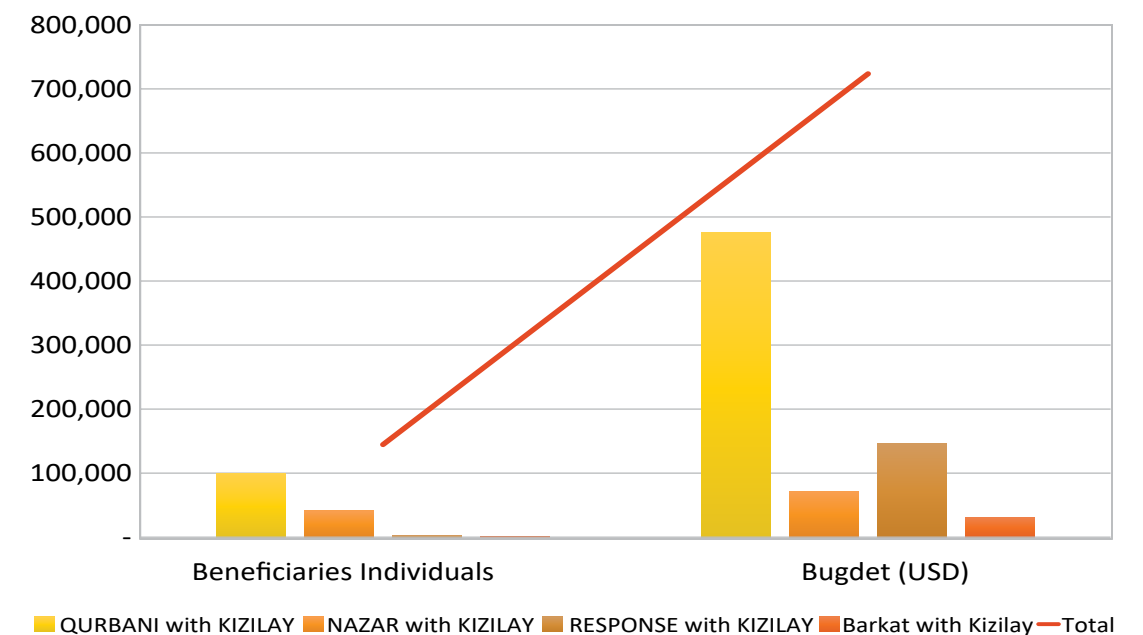

Turkish Cooperation and Coordination Agency (TiKA)



In the '90s, Turkey's first priority regarding the issue of Central Asia became the recognition of the young Turkic countries by the international community. This was followed by our country carrying out projects for our cognates living in the newly founded countries of Central Asia in various fields, such as the social, economic and cultural ones. The aid that was given in the beginning, by time turned into long-term projects and cooperation based on development. The need of an organization that can practice and coordinate the operations to be carried out in this area and for foreign policy priorities arose, and resulted in the establishment of the Turkish Cooperation and Coordination Agency (TİKA) in 1992. With the establishment of the concept of active politics in our foreign policies, TİKA became an implementing intermediary of Turkish foreign policy, particularly in the countries with whom we have shared values, as well as in many other areas and countries. We can briefly summarize TİKA's aims in those years as: the procreation of the own social structure of the Turkic Republics, their construction of an identity in a sustainable way, and the remedy of deficiencies of their technical infrastructures. Many projects and activities in the fields of education, health, restoration, agricultural development, finance, tourism, and industry were realized by TİKA.

Uplift Livestock Farmers



The potential for livestock to transform the social and physical landscapes of developing countries encouraged The NGO World Foundation to design and launch the Barkat Project back in 2012.

In the Barkat model, the farmers takes the responsibility of the care of the cattle by providing fodder and protection, while The NGO World Foundation provides services for the animals' health, training and technical knowledge for the farmers to get the maximum benefit from the cattle, and awareness raising on social issues. After the agreed upon period of time, the animals are sold and the profit is shared between the farmers and the organization. This creates an income source for the poverty stricken families, while the organization uses its share of the profit to target another poor family.

Barkat is a self-sustainable model that creates a chain of beneficiaries. Communities adopt this model as a noble profession compatible with rural values.

Barkat interventions are smallholder-friendly and support small farmers toward attaining UN global Goals. When we count them up,empowering small farmers can help achieve more than half of the 17 Sustainable Development Goals. Empowering small farmers in this creates the motivation

2015, TiKA awarded The NGO World Foundation with financial support to expand its program designed to uplift the rural livestock farmer (household level). The support was to add 90 Cows/Bulls to the livestock based project of poverty alleviation already being implemented in district Khanewal of Punjab province.



to enhance productivity, raise their incomes, and improve their access to humanitarian assistance. These outcomes of Barkat contribute SDG 1 and SDG 2 around poverty alleviation and reducing hunger. Barkat support also leads to more available and acceptable nutritious foods, thereby contributing to SDG 2 that is about food security and nutrition. Further, other types of support by Barkat, such as ensuring that small-scale women farmers have better control over cattle can contribute to gender equality, part of SDG 5.Barkat Investments in climate-smart agriculture are amenable to small farmers and help adapt to and mitigate climate change, SDG 13.

The NGO World Foundation organized an event to launch the Tika supported project. Project launching ceremony was graced by Tika Coordinator in Pakistan and Deputy Commissioner Khanewal was the chief guest of animal handing over ceremony. On this occasion a big number of community representatives and local farmers were present. Deputy Commissioner appreciated the intervention for rural community and paid thanks to Tika for supporting the project in Khanewal.

In the Holy Qur`an:

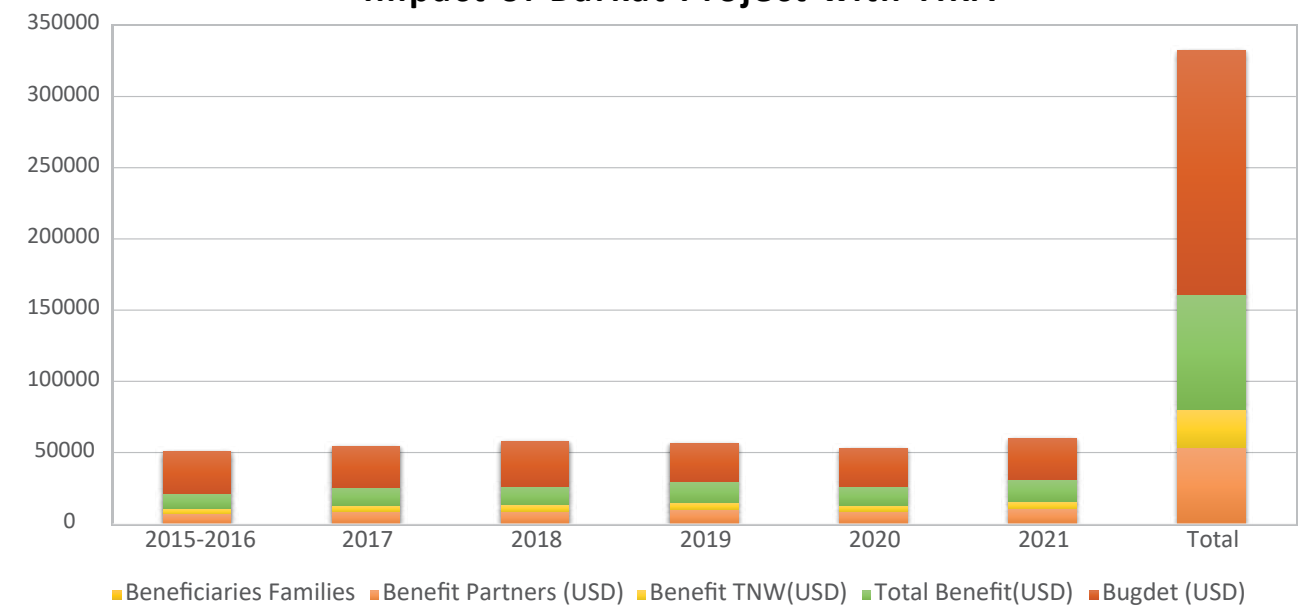

(Statistical, Economic and Social Research and Training Centre for Islamic Countries)



The Statistical, Economic and Social Research and Training Centre for Islamic Countries (SESRIC), was founded as a subsidiary organ of the Organisation of Islamic Cooperation (OIC) in pursuance of Resolution No. 2/8-E adopted by the Eighth Islamic Conference of Foreign Ministers (ICFM), held in Tripoli in May 1977. The Centre started its activities in Ankara on 1 June 1978.

The basic mandate drawn up for SESRIC is threefold:

- To collate, process and disseminate socio-economic statistics and information on and for the utilisation of the member countries,
- To study and evaluate the economic and social developments in the member countries to help generate proposals that will initiate and enhance co-operation among them, and
- To organise training programmes in selected fields geared to the needs of the member countries as well as to the general objectives of the Organisation of Islamic Cooperation.

The NGO World Foundation signed an MOU with the SESRIC. Both organisations agreed to take collaborative actions to build capacity of NGOs from OIC member countries, conduct research and manage events to strengthen professional networking among nonprofits and related departments.

Barkat is a Livestock based model project for poverty alleviation managed under principles of Islamic mode of micro-finance “Mudarabah”. It has been implemented in district Khanewal of Pakistan.

SESRIC launched the report of their research titled.

“BARKAT PROJECT IMPACT ASSESSMENT REPORT 2017”.

Report says “It can be concluded that the Barkat Project is a successful project in the field of poverty alleviation and income diversity. It could be an example for the government and non-governmental organizations working in the sector



of poverty alleviation and capacity building. In addition, special courses can be offered for the university students living in the selected area with a view to develop a system and properly utilize the cow dung in order to produce biogas for household consumption”.

The finding remarks and report has proven the expertise of TNWF for implementing such initiatives. This report is an authentication from SESRIC for other organizations and institutions to replicate this model.

Workshop on “Rural Development Projects Impact Assessment”



SESRIC organised a training course on “Rural Development Projects Impact Assessment” on 21-23 December 2015 in Islamabad, Pakistan, in collaboration with The NGO World Foundation. The course was designed for NGOs working in development areas in Islamabad with a view to building their capacity in the field of project impact analysis.

Enhancing Humanitarian Response and Resilience Through NGOs/CSOs in OIC Member Countries



2 October 2018 Istanbul, Turkey

More than a hundred experts from 20 Muslim nations, many of them members of the Organization of Islamic Cooperation (OIC), convened in the city of Istanbul for a two-day workshop which aimed to promote dialogue and build further capacity for enhancing ‘response’ and ‘resilience’ to humanitarian crises in the 57-member nation block. The consultative workshop came in line with the Global Agenda 2030 as the IsDB remains at the forefront of addressing diverse challenges faced by its member countries in various economic and social sectors.

A policy study has also been commissioned to take stock of the internal strengths, weaknesses, opportunities and threats in relation to the Bank's capability to engage with civil society across all its operations. Moreover, a review and assessment exercise of other Multilateral Development Banks' engagement with CSOs has been carried out to benchmark the policy with the engagement of similar organizations.

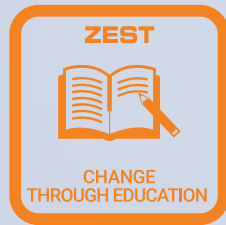

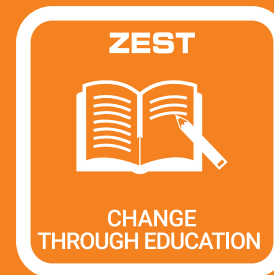


ZEST Schools Concept

ZEST Non-Formal Schools Project (non-formal education) is designed to take out-of-school children to formal education system by completing their five levels of primary education in three years instead of five years termed as accelerated learning. After primary education these children are inducted to mainstream schools at sixth grade and onward. ZEST Non-Formal Schools are open at in the place given by community without any rent or cost. Under this program primary education (Govt. approved syllabus) along with ethical and value based orientation is provided with minimal cost. Teacher's salary, accessories and monitoring expenses are covered from the mentioned amount. Another important feature of the ZEST School is, Students do not have to spend a single penny from their pockets because books, stationery, sitting mats, bags and other accessories are provided them for free. We want education not be burden on the out of school children.

ZEST Aims

- Bring out of school children on educational track;
- Revive the education of students who had left schools;
- Make education attractive for the poor and not to think to educate their kids a burden;
- Join efforts of government & UN to enhance literacy rate particularly among the poor;
- Motivate the teachers to become a role model to their students.





Methodology

For the ZEST Schools Project, TNWF adopted “Non-Formal Education” methodology. This is not surprising, considering that in many disadvantaged areas of Pakistan, particularly the rural parts and slums of large cities, non-formal schools are not an alternative, but rather, the only option children have to gain basic education and literacy skills. Community mobilization and participation are the essence of the non-formal education system. This involvement is a key factor in ensuring that basic education is provided to the disadvantaged. Local populations design, implement and monitor these programs, thus creating a sense of community ownership.

Salient Features

ZEST Non-Formal schools have a number of features which distinguish them from other educational projects in Pakistan. Some of these include;

- Single Room School (Room by Community)
- One Local Female Teacher;
- 30-35 Students per School;
- One Supervisor on 25 Schools;
- Target Age Group (7-14 Years);
- NFE Syllabus Developed by Government;
- No Fee, No Uniform;
- Free Books and Stationery;
- Flexible Timing of School;
- Provision of School Accessories;
- Low Budget Schools;



- Regular Teacher Training and Exposure Visits;
- Regular Monitoring Visits;
- Regular Assessment by Teacher, Supervisor and Manager;
- Extracurricular Activities;
- Awareness Raising/Days Celebration;
- The teachers are selected from the local community;
- The schools are closer in location to the children;
- The curriculum is practical and related to issues children face in their daily lives;
- There is parental and community participation in all of the different levels of the students' education;
- Emphasis is placed on educating girls and underprivileged groups;
- Trainings on Life Skills and Awareness on Social Issues;
- Coordination with Government and Stakeholders;
- Final Examination by Government;
- Mainstreaming of Graduates.

These features also make the schools more cost-effective and time-efficient. It takes only one month to establish a make-shift room in a house or building of a local teacher. In contrast, it takes an average of two years to begin a formal school which must be set up in a new building.

This is why TNWF has adopted this methodology in its ZEST non-formal schools in Karachi. It is a part of their role in the education sector to support the efforts put by the government.



ZEST Educational Scholarships



Mr. Zakullah a teacher, a guide, a mentor and a coach has been reshaping the lives of his students' since 1964. After his retirement he is still attached to his mission with same effectiveness. His teaching methodology is enriched with student's mental training, character building, orientation with life skills, positive thinking approaches, hard work, honesty, sincerity, humbleness and gracefulness. The best way to acknowledge the services of this true teacher, an initiative Program 'Zakullah Educational Scholarships and Training (ZEST)' was designed.

We named it ZEST for Life because we feel it is the continuity of a responsibility, assignment, duty, chore, job and mission to infuse the enthusiasm and passion in the poor pupils and maintain their keenness, zeal and zest to take them out of the box of their poverty and oppression.

ZEST is designed



1. To make education attractive for poor families
2. Poor need not to think educating their kids a burden
3. End drop-out of poor family students
4. To improve the attendance ratio of the poor students
5. To revive the education of students who had left schools in recent years
6. Support the students through scholarship keeping their dignity unharmed
7. To increase literacy rate among poor & oppressed families
8. To acknowledge the efforts of Mr. Zakullah as a teacher for reshaping lives
9. To motivate the teachers for being a Role Model to their pupil as Mr. Zakullah.

To achieve the program objects following activities and interventions will be performed.

1. **ZEST Talent Scholarship:** Scholarships are given to the selected deserving student to fulfil their educational needs. This intervention is a source of motivation for their parents and drive them to continue the educational journey of their child. During the process it is kept in mind that dignity of the students and parents is not harmed so we shall call it "Talent Scholarship".
2. **Training and Coaching:** ZEST adopts short term character education programs of which citizenship is

a part. By developing close working relationship with teachers and school management the performance of these students is monitored and special intention is requested for the selected students to improve their class learning. During vacation special classes and sessions are arranged to induce life skills and provide them mental coaching to make them responsible citizen.

Target Beneficiaries

Students from families which are economically weak and having low awareness about the importance of education and their parents are an obstacle in their studies because these children add-up to the income of the family.

Case Study of Faisal Shazad

"I am a student of BSc mechanical engineering. Here I want to share my experience regarding my journey of education. From my primary education I was a shining student alhamdulillah. I got many distinctions in curricular and co-curricular activities. My father is laborer who wanted me an educated person but financial constraints was a big hurdle in front of him. In 6th class I was introduced with Mr. Zafar Iqbal (Founder, The NGO World Foundation). My teachers briefed him about my talent and hard-working nature. He motivated me to continue my studies till destination and also awarded me with ZEST scholarship to covert my dreams into reality. ZEST gave me a new energy and hope. It helped

me to win the 1st position at my school in matriculation examination. Journey continued and that I did my FSc from a reputed institution. After that, ZEST enabled me to get admission at a well-known University in mechanical engineering discipline. Now I am little away when I will be in the practical life as an engineer.

I have seen big dreams along with supporting my parents and other family members to spend a better life. Inn sha Allah. I would like to say the creator (Allah) blessed me with talent, my great teachers refined me by sharing best of their knowledge while ZEST scholarship helped me not to worry about my educational expenses throughout my journey."

Case Study of Ikram Ali

Mr. Ikram is currently doing a job in a reputed company dealing in textile as associate engineer. He was a good student with many dreams ahead. He was orphan and belongs to a poor laborer family. After completing matriculation he was wondering to secure resources to continue his studies as his family was not in position to afford further educational expenses. One day Mr. Zafar Iqbal (Founder, The NGO World Foundation) come across his mother and asked about his son's education status. She replied that she her son hasn't taken admission in further class due to financial constraints. Mr. Zafar Iqbal awarded him with ZEST scholarship and facilitated him in getting admission at a technical & vocational training institute for associate engineering diploma.

ZEST scholarship enabled him to continue his studies. He completed his diploma in engineering and got a good job in textile sector. Now he is able to support his old mother and other family members. Again ZEST scholarship not only changed his life but also the generation to come.



BARKAT (Poverty Alleviation through Livestock)

In view of the importance of livestock in the economy as well as in the life of a common man, The NGO World Foundation (TNWF) has taken initiatives to join hands with the Government trying by all means to fix priorities to improve the livestock sector that will ultimately contribute to alleviate poverty and raise living standard of the small livestock farmers. Since 2012, The NGO World Foundation in collaboration with donors has launched an initiative titled as BARKAT Project. The benefits of the project to the target beneficiaries are now visible in shape of income enhancement. The NGO World Foundation identifies a serious demand from the people of the area to extend the project and support more and more small farmers to get benefit of this initiative. Healthy outcome of Barkat Project in Dist. Khanewal.

BARKAT Methodology

Under the BARKAT Project, The NGO World Foundation provides bulls (calves) to the selected poor livestock farming families (1 or 2 animals per family depending upon their capacity) by signing a mutual agreement based on specific set of terms and conditions according to the MODARABAH principle of Islamic microfinance. For a period of around 09 to 10 months organization will provide services like medication and awareness while farming family (known as partner) will look after the animals and get benefit out of





it at maturity. After the agreed period animals will be sold and profit will be divided between the beneficiary family and implementing organization according to the terms & conditions of agreement. The partner family gets (67%) of the total profit and enjoy the benefit for its sustainability and it is expected their living standard will be improved while the organization will use the principle amount & profit (33%) to target other poor families to uplift them.

Overall goal of the project is; to improve the living standard of target vulnerable deserving families by using livestock as a tool of poverty alleviation.

Intermediate objectives: include;

1. To enhance the income of beneficiaries by promoting self-employment
2. To raise awareness of better livestock farming/skills and enhance livestock productivity
3. To improve the health condition of the livestock of target families
4. To connect them with livestock service providers and govt. line department
5. To improve the awareness level on social issues

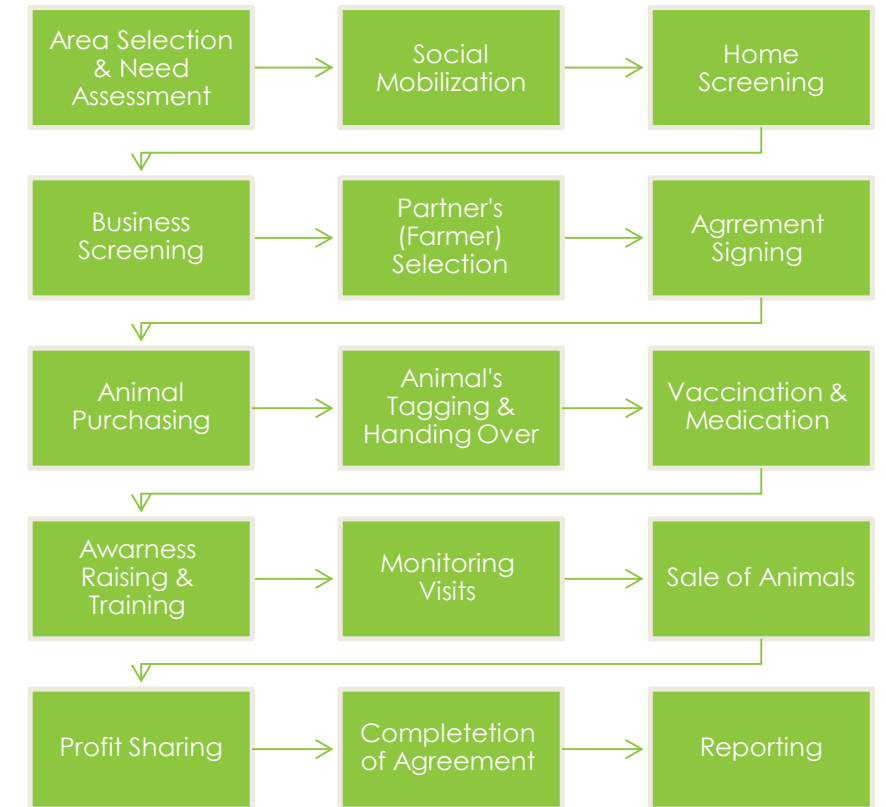
Scope of Project

Barkat is long term program. Planned duration is 9 to 10 months per cycle that will start when the donor signs agreement and then same cycle will be repeated every year and creates chain of beneficiaries.

BARKAT and Global Goals



BARKAT interventions are smallholder-friendly and support & farmers toward attaining UN Sustainable Development Goals. When we count them up, empowering small farmers can help achieve more than half of the 17 Sustainable Development Goals. Empowering small farmers in this creates the motivation to enhance productivity, raise their incomes, and improve their access to humanitarian assistance. BARKAT also leads to more available and acceptable nutritious foods and food security. These outcomes of BARKAT contribute SDG 1 and SDG 2 around poverty alleviation and reducing hunger. Other types of support by BARKAT, such as ensuring that small-scale women farmers have better control over cattle can contribute to gender equality, part of SDG 5. BARKAT Investments in climate-smart agriculture are amenable to small farmers and help adapt to and mitigate climate change, SDG 13.



Mudarabah (Islamic Microfinance)



The Mudarabah contract is a form of partnership between one who contributes capital (Rabb-ul-maal) and the other who contributes efforts in the form of managerial skills (Mudarib). Profit from the outcome of the venture is shared between the capital provider and manager according to mutually agreed profit sharing ratio whilst losses are borne solely by the capital provider, provided such loss is not due to the Mudarib's negligence or violation of specified conditions.



RIDA (Required Initiatives For Daughter's Access)

Women out-number men in Pakistan and are a big human resource but the current plight of the country shows that we are lagging way behind to empower the bigger part of our society. The gateway to a collective development and individual success is only through education and income generation. Keeping in view the prevailing scenario in 2012, RIDA was launched to empower the female segment of the community. The program was designed after the need assessment and gap analysis specified for females.

The aim of RIDA is to encourage candidates aspiring to improve their lives with the vision that economic stability helps women earn a place for themselves in their down trodden families.

RIDA plans to continue to empower vulnerable females with the support of generous likeminded philanthropists.

RIDA by design focuses on the following aspects:

- Provide educational opportunities where there is no access to education
- Raise awareness about personality development, social issues, character building and life skills
- Provide income generating skills to women/girls in need, enabling them to sustain their livelihood and support their families



Many testimonials of oppressed women/girls benefitting from RIDA have come forth. Initiatives taken so far include RIDA educational institutions, RIDA vocational skills centers and awareness raising campaigns.

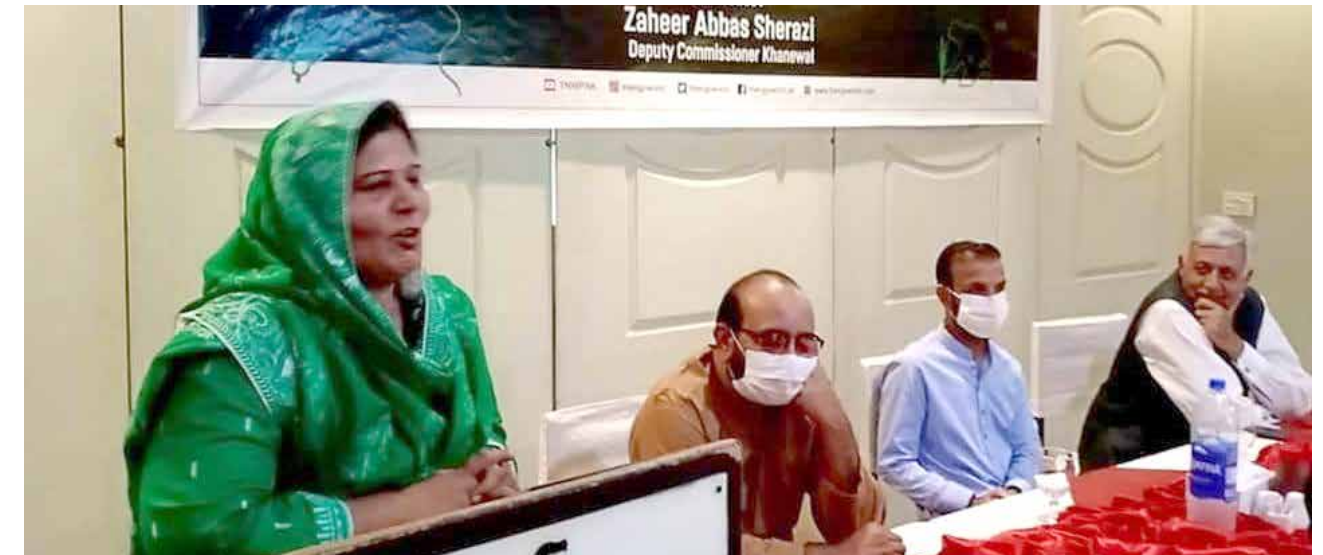

It would be beneficial for their future work as well.

The importance of First Aid to young people, The NGO World Foundation under PATH program has conducted various workshops at our community centers and other educational institutions. We also included our 100 teachers of ZEST schools to learn the First aid skills. Technical support from Pakistan Red Crescent Society-PRCS has been the main factor in successful management of the training workshops.

Volunteer in Service (VIS)



Youth Social Entrepreneurship is becoming popular now a days & it is interesting to see young people engaged in activities that seek to make the world a better place to live in. Instead of just spending their time in front of the television or the computer, a number of young people are choosing to devote their time in sharing amazing ideas on how to protect the environment, empower the poor and start movements that would help other people. These young ones suited to youth social entrepreneurship due to passion and boundless energy they have.

YSE Workshops: Since 2013, The NGO World Foundation under PATH Program has been managing training workshops on the concept of Youth Social Entrepreneurship. YSE trainings provide a road map to youth for their own development by taking self-help initiatives. They become more motivated, empowered and passionate after attending the workshops. Their energies and passion are diverted towards the right direction and their skills are properly utilized for their bright future.

All participants are given assignments to make plan of action for implementation of SDGs at their universities, towns and institutes.

First Aid Training for Young People



Being equipped to respond to a medical emergency brings you one step closer to saving someone's life. Though you may never encounter a critical situation, the chances are you'll one day need to apply your first aid knowledge, meaning you could really help someone in a time of need.

The NGO World Foundation believes that educating youngsters about First Aid is vital and neglecting the importance of first aid could be to the detriment of society, especially since young people are unable to assess risk evaluation in the same way as adults.

With basic first aid training, participants are introduced to fundamental, transferable skills. Learning how to contact emergency services is invaluable, and it also indirectly enhances communication and confidence. First aid training teaches children how to respond to various accidents and emergencies, but in turn will inspire a nation of young leaders. It will encourage youngsters to work as a team, alongside enforcing patience and an ability to listen to others. These versatile skills will continue to benefit youth throughout their lives.



Youth and Global Goals



Young people gifted with imagination, energy and cheerfulness, have the potential to be the key drivers of sustainable development at the local, national and global level. Therefore, as the future inheritors of this planet, young people must spearhead the sustainable development movement and build a new system of governance founded on knowledge sharing, cooperating and prioritizing issues such as extreme poverty, our anthropogenic impact on earth, increasing inequality, and a growing complexity of governance.

The NGO World Foundation organizes sessions on “Youth for SDGs”. University students participate and avail opportunities of orientation, discussion, group work and action planning on SDGs. The session objectives include:

- Build a common understanding of the SDGs.
- Raise awareness of the SDGs among young people in Pakistan
- Evaluate Pakistan’s performance towards achievement of the SDGs.



- Showcase examples of successful campaigns, research and projects that have led to the advancement of the SDGs.

- Facilitate cross-sectoral collaboration between youth and student groups to advance the SDGs;

Participants are assigned to work in groups to explore the actions young people need take to put the SDGs into practice. The groups also discuss barriers to youth for implementation of the SDGs, mapping what youth are already doing that is relevant to the SDGs, discuss actions that young people can take and identify opportunities for collaboration and partnerships among the organizations.





Institute of NGO Leadership and Management (INGOLAM)

There has always been a dire need to make this world a better place to live. All social and developmental initiatives on the part of governments on state level and non-governmental agencies on community levels are a self-evident pursuit in this regard. In developing countries like Pakistan, we don't see much heartening facts and figures when it comes to human development index. Having not so resourceful state machineries, the role of NGOs becomes far more critical in such countries to uplift the living standards and mitigate the miseries of its people. An increasing incidence of natural calamities and man-made disasters calls for incremental support from NGO sector to alleviate the unfavorable circumstances. An enhanced and augmented capacity on the part of these NGOs to brave these daunting challenges is inevitable in general and developing countries in particular.

INGOLAM is one of the core program of The NGO World Foundation. The institute is working on the development of organizational capacity & individuals of NGO sector.

The NGO World Foundation has signed an MOU with the Statistical, Economic and Social Research and Training Centre for Islamic Countries (SESRIC). Both organizations agreed to take collaborative actions to build capacity of NGOs from OIC member countries, conduct research and manage events to strengthen professional networking among nonprofits and related departments. SESRIC is a subsidiary organ of the Organization of Islamic Cooperation (OIC).

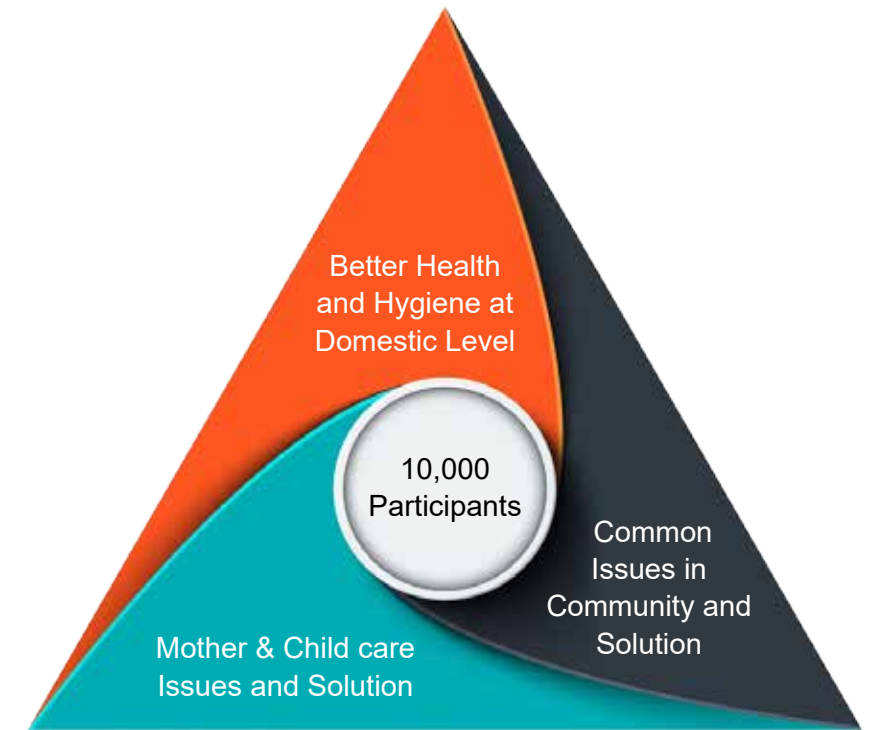

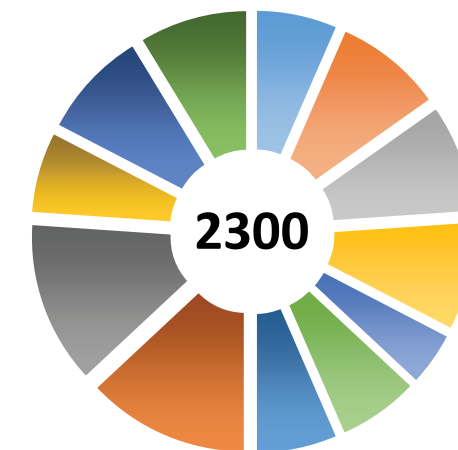

Chief Guest of the ceremony Mr. Ghulam Mustafa (Assistant Commissioner Kabirwala) inaugurated the service along with TNWF board members and said "the free ambulance service is of great importance for the rural population. It will serve 24 hours and will be useful to lessen the difficulties of patients". He acknowledged the valuable contribution of The NGO World Foundation (TNW Foundation) for the sake of humanity.

"TNWF Ambulance Service is being provided with aim to reduce the suffering of humanity. It will help to shift the serious patients to nearby hospitals without any charges and deal with emergencies".





Psycho-Social Care for Flood Victims 2010



The floods in Pakistan began on July 27th, 2010, following heavy monsoon rains. The flood caused unprecedented losses and damages to Pakistan's infrastructure, industry, houses, communications, and roads. This resulted in a creating a phenomenal humanitarian crises.

Psychosocial Consequences of Flood 2010: The physical consequences of flood were quite evident in terms of death, disabilities, and displacement; however, the psychosocial consequences were less obvious. Where the major focus remained on meeting food, shelter and health needs at one end, the well-being of affected people and those rendered vulnerable also became the central concern in the days and weeks following the flood. Moreover, the need of psychosocial support and counselling was evident when assessing the emotional and mental state of adults and children alike. Many organizations have launched initiatives of psycho-social support in the relief phase for communities and individuals to help them cope with their emotions and restore well-being. This assessment has been carried out to identify the psychological / behavioral problems which have resulted after the floods and propose solutions and recommendations, however, before moving to findings, a homogenous understanding of the concepts has been provided below

This psychological assessment report was carried out to identify the psychological and behavioural problems of affected people after the flood and meant to suggest solutions



and recommendations for the identified psycho-social problems. Major findings of this report were significant in the following respects:

- It acted as a reference for identifying psychosocial issues in affected people of flood affected areas in Layyah, including factors contributing to these issues
- It highlighted problems, assumptions and risk factors in relation to affected people both in camps and host communities.

TNWF's Response: With the collaboration of Basic Needs Basic Rights and HANDS, Mr. Mohammad Arshad Bhatti Manager Operations, The NGO World Foundation attend the 10 days TOT in Karachi. After this start activity in flood affected area of District Layyah (Punjab). 05 Days training held for 06 volunteers in Multan and Layyah. In the outcome of this training these volunteers trained 140 local volunteers for field activities. Through awareness campaign in 05 villages 2000 people aware about the need of Psychosocial care. 15 local influential were trained about the model of Basic Needs to get their help in field for the identification of mentally ill people. 50 patients were identified from different areas. 25 patients attended the psychosocial care medical camp and got initial medication.

COVID-19 Awareness Raising Camps



COVID-19 Awareness Raising Camp was organised by The NGO World Foundation in Khanewal. Deputy Commissioner Khanewal and relevant authorities joined the activities to sensitise the community about prevailing situation. We distributed masks and hand sanitizers.



Water for Thar Project



Water for Thar is an effort to provide drinking water for humans and cattle of Thar.

The Tharparkar district, spread over 22,000 square kilometres, is a chronically poor area

which is often hit by drought as there are no rains over the years and shortage of water is the main concern. It's estimated population is 1.2 million, 95 % of which live in around 2,000 villages. Water shortage is a major problem, where dug-wells are the only sustainable source of groundwater. Villagers spend around four to six hours daily to fetch five to six litres water from these dug-wells, situated far and wide.

The social life of villagers is also restricted due to lack of adequate water. This especially affects women, who are responsible for carrying water. Young children often have to forgo education due to responsibility of fetching water.

With support of philanthropists and donors, TNWF is reaching the far off areas to digging wells and making arrangements to install solar powered water solutions to provide water for drinking and other usage.

This project will improve the socioeconomic conditions of the people of Tharparkar in general and women and children in particular. Due to scarcity of water and non-existence of water resources in their own Goths (villages) the women and children have to travel long distances daily to fetch water from far flung areas. The water solar powered wells and borings will provide drinking as well as usable water at their doorstep which will also improve their health.



Road Safety: Donkey carts and rishkaws to get reflectors



To prevent road accidents "The NGO World Foundation" has launched a self-help campaign to affix reflectors on rickshaws and other slow-moving carts.

Khanewal: The donkey carts and bull carts are used for transporting goods, vegetables, and cattle feed to the city markets from fields. The auto-rickshaws are the main source of mobility for citizens in our small towns and cities. Young and old people in our rural and urban areas use rickshaws and donkey carts to earn a living. Many accidents happen due to fog especially when traveling on the roads at night. One of the main reasons for these accidents is the lack of reflectors on their vehicles. In accidents, drivers are sometimes injured and sometimes lose their lives. It causes loss of both lives and livelihood. On the same time families of the victims also suffer.

To prevent these accidents to some extent "The NGO World Foundation" has launched a self-help campaign to affix reflectors on rickshaws and other slow-moving carts.

The volunteers of the organization fix reflectors on the rickshaw/donkey cart and at the same time highlight their importance. Such measures will also create awareness among others.



The NGO World Foundation and Global Goals

The UN's 2030 Agenda for Sustainable Development, featuring the 17 Sustainable Development Goals was unanimously adopted by world leaders at a historic UN summit in September 2015. TNWF believes civil society organizations play a vital role in providing basic services to communities that governments and the private sector are unable to reach. To achieve the UN's ambitious goals by 2030, civil society organizations must also be prepared for an active role in selecting success indicators.

TNWF is linking thousands of youth, NGO's workers, professionals and researchers daily in online collaboration and engagement, launched a major effort to mobilize its global network and other global partners to realize the Sustainable Development Goals (SDGs), a set of targets relating to future international development.

SDGs and Pakistan:

According to Planning Commission of Pakistan, we have prioritized the Sustainable Development Goals which will enable us to join the league of upper middle class countries by 2030. Pakistan was the first country to adopt SDGs 2030 agenda through a unanimous resolution of parliament.

Our Minister for Planning, Development & Reform said;

"We believe that SDGs agenda for development isn't an international agenda; it is our own agenda. It reflects our ambition and desire to give our people better quality of life.

"TNWF aims to mobilize NGOs to play a significant role in the context of national SDG an implementation that we consider particularly relevant: holding the stakeholders to account, implementing projects, and communicating the SDGs."





Therefore, we must take ownership of SDGs with complete devotion and passion”.

The NGO World Foundation ensures to incorporate all programs activities and objectives linked with SDGs. TNWF under this program also provides the opportunities to youth, NGOs and other stakeholders to build their capacities so that everyone can contribute towards the global goals.

SDGs Model Village

Keeping in mind the fact, achieving the SDGs to end hunger and extreme poverty by 2030 will depend crucially on developing rural areas in the poorest nations of the world,



The goals of Converting Ghareeb Abad Village into SDGs Model Village will be achieved by increasing the attention in youth development through knowledge, skills and participation in development activation.

Pakistan SDGs Forum

TNWF has taken a practical initiative “SDGs Model Village”. Through this initiative we plan to address some crucial issues, like financing productive investment, harnessing technology for agriculture transformation, promoting entrepreneurial rural economies and combining infrastructure investment that mainly impacts on productivity which subsequently creates enough livelihood activities in rural areas.



25th September 2018: The NGO World Foundation organized an event “Pakistan SDGs Forum 2018”. It was to celebrate SDGs Day in Pakistan that is part of Global campaign to Localize SDGs. Representatives of Planning Commission Pakistan, Universities, Youth Groups and Civil Society organizations graced the forum.

Representatives from Planning Commission of Pakistan, UNDP along with large number of representatives of civil society organizations, University students, youth and school children were part of this forum.

“The NGO World Foundation” expressed its strong support for an ambitious, transformative and inclusive post 2015 agenda and aimed the creation of a “Pakistan SDGs Forum”.

Mr. Zafar Iqbal, Executive Director, TNWF addressed the audience and shared the objectives of the forum. 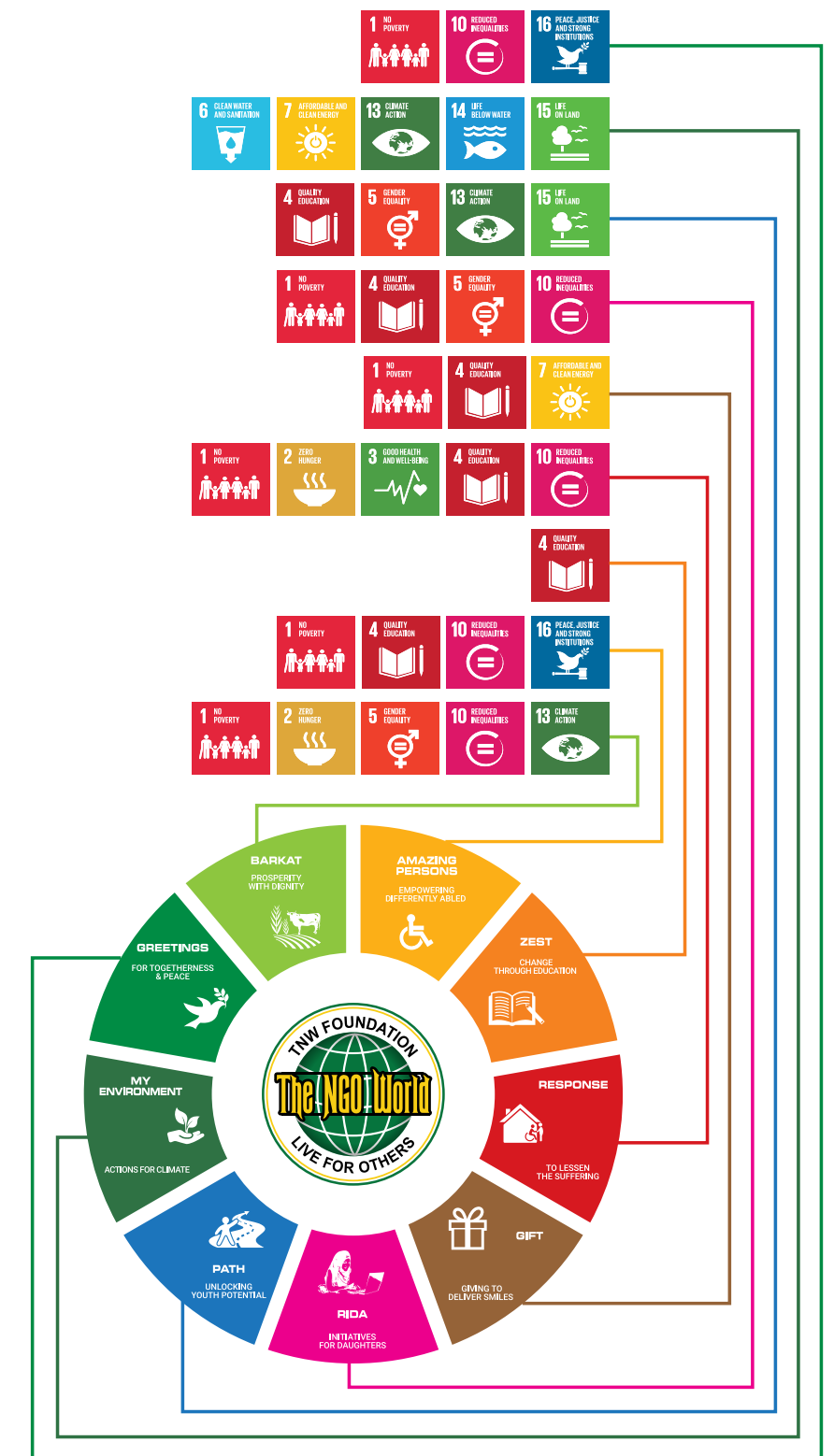
Dr. Shoukat, Director Volunteer In Service department of CUST also addressed and shared the role of educational institutes and students for the development of SDGs.

4. **Sustainability:** will the initiative/practice described leave a lasting legacy and can it be replicated by other actors in their respective areas?
5. **Inclusion:** has the nominee been inclusive, engaging the individual strengths, talents and experiences of teams and considered all groups of society or stakeholders in providing social services?



6. **Innovative:** has the nominee used innovative approaches and made the best use of the technology available?
7. **Children's Social Worker:** if someone have made a positive difference to the lives of children through their outstanding work.
8. **Student Social Worker:** open to all university students studying social work who are showing outstanding potential in their studies. They will be able to demonstrate how they have surpassed expectations and have a thorough understanding of social work theory and practice.
9. **UN-SDGs:** are you as an individual or organization taking actions to help achieve the United Nation Sustainable development Goals?
10. **Made the Pakistan Proud:** If you are working diligently to promote a pro-Pakistan image around the globe and your efforts determine the quality of the social change that we all desire to manifest in Pakistan?



TNW Community Centers-TNWCC

TNW Community Centers are public locations where members of a community tend to gather for group activities, social support, public information, and other purposes. TNW Community Centers are established and equipped to work as a potential institutional vehicle to address day to issues of the community by ensuring their participation. "TNWCC acts as an institution within the community where society is directly involved in the development process.

In different project areas, The NGO World Foundation (TNWF) has introduced concept of TNWCC as a solution to provide learning access to the community within their system. Through this concept, The NGO World Foundation tries to cover the learning needs of children and adults in the same institution, which is cost-effective.

The role of TNWCC is also based on arts, leisure and social activities in promoting adult well-being and healthy lifestyles. With support of philanthropists, TNWF plans to establish more community centers to promote lifelong learning in the country.



One of the key objectives of TNWCC is to empower backward and marginalized communities. The TNWCCs provide lifelong learning opportunities to the community members including adults, women, youth, and children. It is a multi-functional platform to be used for basic and post-literacy, continuing education, skill training, saving and income generation activities.

Case Study

TNWCC Pasban Chowk Karachi

The NGO World Foundation has been working in the areas of Goth Ali Akbar Shah (Korangi Karachi) and surroundings since 2016. Passing through time, TNWF realized that there should be a setup or center where community, especially females, children and youth can get knowledge to improve their life skills. For this purpose, TNWF decided to establish a community learning center.

To serve the purpose mentioned above a TNWCC was inaugurated at Pasban Chowk in April 2019. Prof. Muhammad Ekhlauque from Institute of Business and Management (IBM), Dr. Shahid, Head of Social Work Department University of Karachi, , Dr. Mumtaz Ali (Assistant Professor Sociology Department, University of Sindh) and Mr. Zafar Iqbal, Chairman TNWF inaugurated the TNWCC.

TNWCC Pasban Chowk is serving the local community with variety of services including;

1. Basic computer learning course is being offered for young girls and boys of the area. Students of madaris and school are being benefited by this facility provided at their door step. It is observed sometime elders also show



their interest in latest trends of IT. The short computer course helps the attendees to get jobs in industry and shopping malls.

2. To fulfil the need and desire of young boys and girls regarding English language, a short language course has been initiated at TNWCC. It is equally useful for the teachers teaching in private schools around Pasban chowk area. They improve their English speaking proficiency and then teach their students better.
3. Awareness raising session for mother has been very important intervention at TNWCC. 100 young educated girls were trained as master trainer by an extensive training course. These teacher were given knowledge about mother and child care, health hygiene and importance of education for generation along with communication skills. These master trainer then delivered sessions to the women of the area. Every master trainer deliver knowledge to at least 100 other women and total number exceeds 10,000 women.
4. TNWCC believes, community organization and participation is very essential to sustain the development initiatives. Our experts organize the community members into a CO (Community Organization) by sensitizing them on a common goals "To Live Better". CO formation around the TNWCC is proved as a main driving force of community development.



5. Youth trainings to impart the life skills and improve their communication is essential part of TNWCC. It polishes them and enable them to interact well and perform better at levels of their engagement.
6. Volunteerism is an important tool to mobilize community particularly the youth to take self-help initiatives. TNWCC conducts sessions to make them realize, how they can participate and play role in improving the lives of their own people. Volunteers are empowered and involved in various activities of their interest and passion.
7. Cleanliness campaigns are carried out by the volunteers and learners of TNWCC. It creates a movement among the masses to keep their surrounding clean and green. Time to time activities are helpful in keeping the community involved and mobilized. Such campaigns of TNWCC are proved much helpful to create consciousness about diseases caused by the dirty conditions and importance of cleanliness regarding health.
8. Doctors and health care professionals are motivated by TNWCC staff to arrange free medical camps and provide treatment to the poor patients around TNWCC surroundings. TNWCC provides them the platform and facilitation to conduct their valuable service to the needy community. 100s of poor patients in need of medical service get benefited by such interventions at TNWCC.



9. Vocational and technical skills are very important for the youth to get jobs and sustain their livelihood. TNWCC identifies the technical training opportunities refer to interested youngsters. TNWCC also acts as a bridge between the service providers like Memon Industrial & Technical Institute Korangi, AMAN Tech, UNDP and many others.
10. TNWCC has established successful coordination with GEAR TRUST to implement their interest free loan scheme in its target areas. These loans are helping the small business owners and entrepreneurs to expand and sustain their livelihood.
11. TNWCC facility and volunteers are always available to government campaigns like polio eradication, awareness on heat stroke in summer, sensitizing community about COVID19 to keep distance & wearing masks and many other actions of public welfare and safety.
12. TNWCC manages different art competitions to enhance knowledge and create awareness among the children. They make posters on environmental issues, social problems, national heroes and many other areas of their interest.
13. Different national and international days are celebrated at TNWCC. Poster competitions, seminars and walks are arranged by our volunteers to raise the awareness each year on World Water Day, Heath Day, International Literacy Day, World Toilet Day, Global Handwashing Day, International Volunteer Day, Salam Teacher Day, Environment Day, Pakistan Independence Day, Quaid Day and Iqbal Day.



World NGO Day celebrations in Pakistan

World NGO Day is an international calendar day annually observed on 27 February with aim to inspire people to become more actively involved within NGOs and encourage a greater symbiosis between NGOs and both the public and private sector.

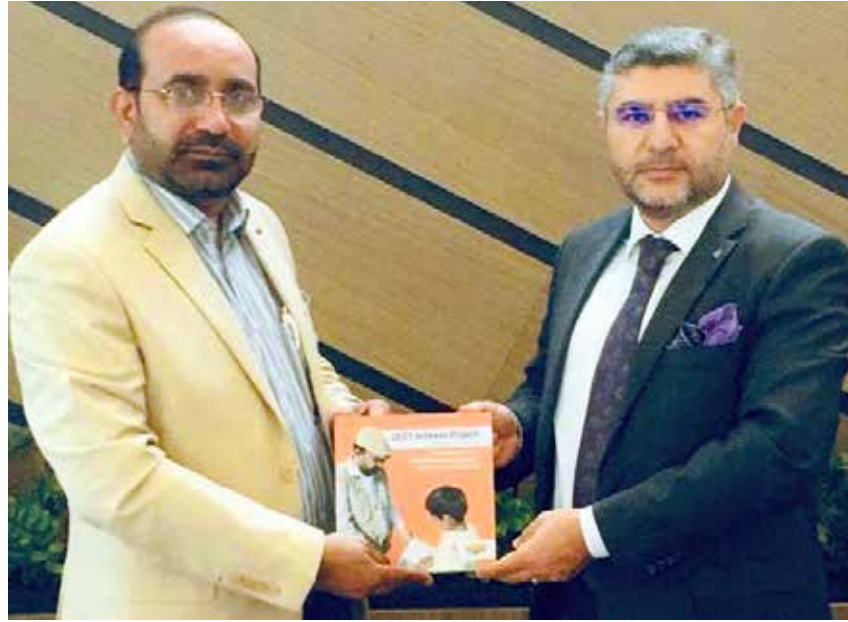
